Answer: Our current infrastructure consists of fiber (1gb) connection to each school site using a Cisco router/switch connection as management. All internet access goes out through our gateway located at the District Office. We have wireless AP in each classroom in the District running on an Enterasys\Extreme platform.

Answer: We do not own our switches; they are part of the WAN agreement with our current provider. We are moving toward owning our switches and developing a foundation for VoIP
