#### School Board of Gadsden County, Florida CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT Fiscal Year: 2011-2012

This contractual agreement is made between the <u>School Board of Gadsden County, Florida</u>, a school district, referred to as the "RECIPIENT", organized and existing under the laws of the State of Florida, with its principal place of business at 35 Martin Luther King., Jr. Blvd, City of Quincy, County of Gadsden, State of Florida, herein referred to as the Board, (also referred to as the District) and <u>Sherrie Taylor, LLC</u> a for-profit educational consulting agency organized and existing as a <u>Florida</u> corporation with its principal place of business at <u>P.O. Box 1602</u>, <u>Quincy, FL 32353</u> for the purposes of providing professional development and instructional support, herein referred to as "CONTRACTOR or SUB-RECIPIENT". The contractual agreement will establish uniform administrative requirements for the Contractor or Sub-recipient and the School Board of Gadsden County.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

## ARTICLE 1. ENGAGEMENT OF THE CONTRACTOR

The RECIPIENT agrees to engage the CONTRACTOR and the CONTRACTOR agrees to continue to perform the functions as outlined in her response to a Bid Process and Recommendation for Award of Contract for contracted services to Gadsden County as the Title X Homeless Education Liaison, which was approved by the Gadsden County School Board on October \_\_\_, 2010 and as further set forth below. #### ARTICLE 5. PAYMENT

# ARTICLE 7. ACCESS AND RETENTION OF RECORDS

The RECIPIENT shall have access to all CONTRACTOR'S records that are directly pertinent to this AGREEMENT. The CONTRACTOR shall retain all required records for five (5) years after the RECIPIENT makes the final payment and all other pending matters are closed. ## ARTICLE 8. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

The parties hereto contemplate this contract to run for the duration of the grant award subject to annual review and renewal as required by law. Any party wishing to terminate this contract prior to its expiration date shall provide the other party with sixty (60) days written notice. Upon termination, RECIPIENT shall be responsible for payment of all costs incurred by CONTRACTOR in the performance of the Agreement prior to termination.

#### ARTICLE 9. AMENDMENTS

Any changes must be mutually agreed upon and incorporated in written amendments to this AGREEMENT.

#### ARTICLE 10. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

The CONTRACTOR is an independent CONTRACTOR and not an employee or agent of the RECIPIENT. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all requirements of the Jessica Lunsford Act. CONTRACTOR shall be acting as independent CONTRACTOR in the performance of this Agreement, and shall be responsible for the payment of claims for loss, personal injury, death, property damage, or otherwise arising out of any act or omission of their respective employees or agents in connection with the performance of the Services for which they may be held liable under applicable law. Each party shall maintain at its sole expense adequate insurance or self-insurance coverage to satisfy its obligations under this Agreement.

This instrument, including any attachments, embodies the entire AGREEMENT of the parties. There are no other provisions, terms, conditions, or obligations. This AGREEMENT supersedes all previous oral or written communications, representations or agreements on this subject.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST: As of the date of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR is not a party to any oral or written contract or understanding or legal or regulatory obligation that will in any way limit or conflict with its ability to fulfill the terms of the Agreement.
