The District shall coordinate with local law enforcement agencies to provide school resource officers (SROs) to those schools within the district where a need for a SRO has been determined.

Definition

<u>A school resource officer is a sworn law enforcement officer who has completed</u> <u>a course of instruction specified by statute or regulation for SROs and is assigned</u> <u>to the school district to act as a law enforcement officer.</u>

Each SRO is appointed and assigned to an eligible school by the law enforcement agency employing the SRO. Each SRO serves in accordance with a written agreement memorandum of understanding entered into by the District and the law enforcement agency employing the SRO.

Each principal or his/her designee shall have administrative responsibility of the SRO's performance of his school activities. All administrators who have a SRO assigned to their campus shall ensure that the SRO is trained and knowledgeable regarding all Board policies/regulations which pertain to the SRO's activities on the school campus and at school sponsored events.

Jurisdiction

School administrators and staff will have the primary responsibility for maintaining proper order in schools and for disciplining students for violations of board policies and school rules. A school resource officer is not a school disciplinarian and will not be requested or permitted to intervene in school discipline matters unless authorized by the District's code of conduct. The administrator or other school officials may refer Level II misconduct to the SRO or other local law enforcement authorities only when the conduct rises to a level of criminality, the conduct presents an immediate safety risk, or the conduct is the third or subsequent act which rises to a level of criminality in that school year.

Upon observation or notification of a criminal offense by district or building-level administration, the administrator will immediately contact the SRO, or local law enforcement authorities if the SRO is unavailable or circumstances warrant otherwise. When referral to law enforcement is required, the SRO will be the first line of contact for local law enforcement to ensure that the matter is resolved promptly to decrease significant interruption to the learning process. The SRO is to be contacted immediately to handle a disturbance or emergency regarding a visitor or employee who disrupts the learning environment or school activity.

Roles and Responsibilities

<u>A SRO's role and responsibility in the school setting will include, but not be limited to, the following:</u>

- Establish and maintain a close partnership with the school administration and staff to maintain a safe and constructive learning environment.
- Enforce local, state and federal laws.
- Serve as a resource to administrators and staff concerning law enforcement and child welfare issues.
- Serve as a liaison between the school and the law enforcement agency in addressing issues of concern to both entities.
- Develop educational programs and activities on topics such as crime prevention that will increase a student's knowledge of and respect for the law and the function of law enforcement agency programs.
- <u>Assist in emergency crisis planning and building security matters</u> <u>including, but not limited to, conducting security inspections to deter</u> <u>criminal or delinquent activities.</u>
- <u>Provide consultation and support to improve school/law enforcement</u> <u>collaboration.</u>

Memorandum of Understanding

The roles and responsibilities listed above are in addition to any outlined in the requisite memorandum of understanding (MOU) executed between the District and the local law enforcement agency employing the SRO. Prior to a SRO being placed in a school district, a MOU must be executed defining the role of the school district, individual schools, local law enforcement agencies, school administration, and the school resource officer. At the beginning of each school year, district administration will review the terms of the MOU with, and provide a copy to, both the building-level administration and the school resource officer.

Additional School Security

The District may, in its discretion, contract with local law enforcement agencies and/or private security agencies to provide security at schools or schoolsponsored functions in lieu of, or to supplement, school resource officers.

Compared to other community emergencies, the covert and criminal nature of bombing incidents make detection and disarming of explosive devices a highly dangerous problem for police authorities of smaller communities with only limited resources. We in the City of Georgetown are fortunate in having a Bomb Disposal Expert as a member of the City Police Department.

Experience shows that over 95% of all written or phoned bomb threats are hoaxes. However, the chance remains that the threat may be authentic and appropriate action should be taken in each case to provide for the safety of people and property and to locate an actual or incendiary device so that it can be neutralized.

- 1. In event of bomb threat, IMMEDIATELY notify the Georgetown City Police Department and the Georgetown County Sheriff's Office. The Police Department telephone number is 546-4141 and the Sheriff's Office is 546-5101.
- 2. Upon receipt of a bomb threat, the building management whether or not to clear the building for the safety of the occupants. The building can be searched most effectively by persons familiar with the building. The search can be organized as follows:
 - Maintenance and janitorial personnel search such areas as hallways, rest rooms, stairwells, utility closets and areas outside the building.
 - b) Officer personnel search their immediate office area.
 - c) Cafeteria personnel search the kitchen and dining room area.
 - d) If a school is involved, teachers search their own classrooms. Personnel doing a search MUST NOT MOVE any unfamiliar or suspicious package but must report the objects description to an official supervising the search procedure. It must be strongly emphasized to all persons searching, that any movement of an explosive device by an untrained person may cause detonation. DO NOT TOUCH THE OBJECT.
- 3. Notify the building manager or person in charge of the searchers who in turn should immediately notify the police. This information should be

relayed immediately to a central point in the building which should be named by building management and the police.

- 4. If a strange object is found IT SHOULD BE ASSUMED TO BE A BOMB.
 - a) Unless required by duty to remain in the vicinity of the object, all personnel should be cleared from the site. Guides may be required to escort the bomb disposal team to the site.
 - b) The danger area should be marked and blocked off to at least 100 feet; the area above and below the object should be included.
 - c) Search personnel may assist by checking to see that all doors and windows are open to minimize blast effects and damage if a bomb is detonated.
 - d) The use of two-way (walkie-talkie) radios within five feet or more of the suspected object is dangerous because radio frequency can cause detonation of electrically operated blasting caps.
 - e) If a light switch is off DO NOT TURN IT ON, use a flashlight. If the light switch is on DO NOT TURN IT OFF IT COULD IN EITHER CASE CAUSE DETONATION of a device. The same rules apply to an air conditioner, it is on leave it so, if off do not turn it on.
 - Bomb Disposal and de-activation requires intensive training, even the experts are not immune to danger, therefore only the most experienced persons are able to cope with suspicious objects.

Disposal or disarming of the device which ordinarily constitutes a serious problem for police officials. The U. S. Army will provide bomb disposal services for communities which do not have bomb disposal capabilities.

Overall Program:

The 2016 Local Bond Referendum provided Georgetown County School District with approximately \$165 million in funding for additions and renovations of existing public school buildings. Included in that referendum are additions to each of the High Schools of an auxiliary gymnasium, tennis courts, upgrades to the running track surface, general renovation work, as well as, required maintenance mainly related to roofing and HVAC improvements. Improvements to the Middle and Elementary Schools include one auxiliary gymnasium, expansions to several dining areas, general renovation work and required maintenance including roofing and HVAC improvements.

Design and Pre-Construction Status:

Design work continues on all four High Schools and Waccamaw Intermediate School. Schematic design reviews have been completed on all five projects and those projects are now in the Design Development stage. Currently all of the projects are within budget and there remains a high probability we will be able to provide some added scope at each project.

With the confirmation of the locations of the additions at all of the projects, underground surveys and soil boring activities are currently underway or are in the process of getting started.

Bids for the Georgetown and Waccamaw High School asphalt work for the running tracks are due on October 12th. Engineering work on the tracks for Andrews High School and Carvers Bay High School is currently being completed. Bids for that asphalt work will be due in November.

Interviews for Construction Management at Risk services have been completed and we are currently negotiating contracts with five firms. Those firms will be providing pre-construction services for the Design Development stage of the projects. Awards for those services will be presented at the next board meeting.

The first meeting on the first phase of Howard Adult Center with Red Iron Architecture and staff took place on October 10th. Design services are currently in progress on that project.

Approvals and Bid Status: No issues at this time.

Construction Status:

The final inspection for the re-roofing project at Kensington Elementary School is scheduled October 12th. Carpet removal and replacement of six classrooms at Waccamaw Middle School is in progress with that project scheduled to be complete the week of October 16th.

Other Issues:

No other issues at this time.



Andrews High School

Scope of work includes the addition of an auxiliary gymnasium, expansion of the welding and small engine repair shops, resurfacing of the running track, tennis courts, upgrades to the athletic fields, general renovations as well as required maintenance items including HVAC upgrades and a new fire alarm system

Status

A review of the schematic drawings was held with the School's Staff on September 28th. All of the Bond Program scope is included in the design and is within budget. At this time we are also including in the design the potential to add renovations to the existing field house and provide a new home side toilet and storage building, which would be beyond the Bond Program Scope of work.

The engineer is scheduled to complete Design work for the running track asphalt package the week of October 9th. Upgrades to the parking area of Andrews Elementary School are currently being reviewed to be included with the paving. We are working with the Architect and his Engineer's to include all of the HVAC roof top units at Rosemary Middle School in the scope of work with Andrews High School in an effort to minimize the cost of just replacing the gymnasium units at Rosemary Middle School.

The review meeting for the Schematic drawings was held in September with approval to proceed with the design of the additions. We were able to meet with OSF last month and we were advised to verify the existing structure in relation to code compliance. The project team has made several inspections and revealed several issues which need to be corrected, but there does not appear to be any major concerns involved. We are still seeking confirmation from OSF on the design to move forward and this has slowed progress in terms of schedule. This is the most complex project we have and will be the most challenging to both design and build.

The asphalt portion of the running track is scheduled to receive bids on October 12th.
