End of Year Grading and Procedures

IMPORTANT DATES

The lack of participation and/or poor achievement with Learning From Home will NOT impact student grading in a negative manner. Students may ONLY IMPROVE their grade through the work completed during the Learning from Home Plan.

Elementary Schools

Grades

- All Elementary students will receive a Satisfactory (S) for Q4.
- Elementary teachers will document mastery of standards with a Pass (P) or Fail (F) final averages for the yearly average.
- After May 13th, teachers will have the opportunity to reconcile student assignments, work with their most at-risk students, and continue to collect assignments as needed.

Retention/Promotion

- Unless unique circumstances existed prior to Learning From Home, elementary students will be promoted to the next grade level.
- Promoted students may need additional remediation support during the 2020-2021 school year



Middle Schools

Grades

- Middle school students will receive numerical grades. Learning From Home performance can and often will positively impact student grades.
- After May 13th, teachers will have the opportunity to reconcile student assignments, work with their most at-risk students and continue to collect assignments as needed.
- For semester and year long classes, the 4th nine weeks grade will be equal to or higher than the 3rd nine weeks final average.
- Eighth grade courses in which students earn high school credit will follow high school grading guidance.

Retention/Promotion

- Unless unique circumstances existed prior to Learning From Home , middle school students will be “promoted” to or “placed” into the next grade level.
- “Placed” students may need additional remediation support during the 2020-2021 school year.

High Schools

Grades

- High school students will receive numerical grades. Learning From Home performance can and often will positively impact student grades.
- After May 11th, teachers will have the opportunity to reconcile student assignments, work with their most at-risk students, and address End-of-Year procedures.
- For semester and year long classes, students will receive a 2nd semester final average grade that is equal to or higher than the grade on record as the 3rd Term progress calculation.
- For nine-week classes, the 4th nine weeks grade will be the Learning From Home average. The lowest possible grade will be a 70.
- There will be no spring final exams nor EOC exams. Therefore, the 20% EOC exam calculation will be coded as EXEMPT for these courses.
- Note: AP Exam scores are administered separately by the College Board; these exam scores do not impact student grades. Teachers may continue to hold ungraded review sessions to help students prepare.

Retention/Promotion

- Student promotion for high school students will continue to be determined by earned units of credit.
- Seniors who had failed to meet graduation requirements before Learning From Home will be able to work through May 22nd (with no new assignments) to qualify for graduation.
