New York State Immunization Requirements for School Entrance/Attendance

Children in a prekindergarten setting should be age-appropriately immunized. The number of doses depends on the schedule recommended by the Advisory Committee for Immunization Practices (ACIP). For grades pre-kindergarten through 8, intervals between doses of vaccine should be in accordance with the ACIP-recommended immunization schedule for persons 0 through 18 years of age. (Exception: intervals between doses of polio vaccine need to be reviewed only for grades prekindergarten, kindergarten, 1,2,6,7 and 8.) Doses received before the minimum age or intervals are not valid and do not count toward the number of doses listed below. Intervals between doses of vaccine DO NOT need to be reviewed for grades 9-12. See footnotes for specific information for each vaccine. Children who are enrolling grade-less classes should meet the immunization requirements of grades for which they are age equivalent. “School Bus Safety Is... One Bus Stop at a Time.”

Be cool... follow the rules:

1. Be ready when the bus arrives. You are required to be at your stop 10 minutes before your scheduled pick-up time.
2. The driver has the right to assign seats.
3. Always cross at least 10 feet in front of the bus and wait for the driver’s signal. Never crawl under a bus and never go behind the bus.
4. If you need to go to a different location, your parent or guardian must send a written request to the school office. You cannot ride a different bus or get off at a different bus stop without a bus pass issued by the school office.
5. No food or gum is allowed on the bus. Alcohol and tobacco are forbidden.
6. No skateboards or rollerblades are allowed on the bus. Musical instruments that will not fit in a student’s lap cannot be transported to or from school on the buses.
7. No aerosol cans are allowed on a school bus (bug spray, hair spray, etc.)
8. You must stay in your seat while the bus is in motion, with arms and legs kept out of the aisle.
9. Remain seated until the bus stops at your destination.
10. Head and/or arms must not be thrust out windows.
11. Quarreling, fighting, or rough play will not be tolerated.
12. Swearing or abusive language must not be used. Yelling or shouting cannot be allowed. It can distract the driver and cause an accident.
13. For the safety of our youngest elementary students in K-4 we ask that they be released to a parent/guardian or responsible adult. If a parent/guardian/responsible adult is not present, elementary students in grades Kindergarten through 4th grade will remain on the bus.

Message From The Transportation Department

Plan to be at your bus stop ten minutes before your scheduled pick up time. Times may vary slightly during the first week, then they should become regular and dependable.

Initial Notification To Persons In Parental Relation And Staff Pursuant

Section 409-h of the State Education Law and Commissioner's Regulation 155.24.*

September 2019

Dear Parent, Guardian, and School Staff;

New York State Education Law Section 409-H and State Education Department Commissioner's Regulation 155.24, effective July 1, 2001, require all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year. The Hadley-Luzerne Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
- Anti-microbial products;
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- Boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- The application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- The application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list. If you would like to receive 48-hour prior notification of pesticide applications that are scheduled to occur in your school, please complete the form below and return it to Regina York, District Clerk, HLCS, PO BOX 200, Lake Luzerne, NY 12846. Claude Wright is the school pesticide representative. He can be contacted for further information on these requirements by calling 696-2112 X3139.

Student Accident Insurance

Should a student at the Hadley-Luzerne Central School District be injured at an approved school function, the parent or guardian must notify the appropriate Health Office and acquire appropriate insurance form (Parent Part B). The form must be completed by the parent/guardian and mailed to the address on the form. No claim is filed if the Health Office has not received written notification of the injury from the supervisor. (Always keep copies) The School District provides a very limited Student Accident Insurance Policy which may provide some excess coverage. This coverage is initiated after the parents/guardians' personal health plan has been used. Therefore, ALL BILLS related to the injury will first be paid by the family health insurance carrier. Should a balance remain, it should be submitted to the school's Student Accident Insurance Carrier. The amount of coverage if any, is determined by the insurance company, not the school. The benefits payable by the School Insurance carrier for school related claims are according to a fee schedule. ANY REMAINING BALANCE WILL BE THE PARENT'S RESPONSIBILITY. NO CLAIM IS FILED UNTIL THE PARENT COMPLETES PART B ON THE BLUE FORM AND MAILS IT TO THE INSURANCE COMPANY (THE PHONE NUMBER AND ADDRESS IS ON THE FORM).

Family Rights

Each year we like to remind parents that you have the following rights according to Section 99.7 of the Family Rights and Privacy Act of 1974:

1. The right to inspect and review the student's education records.
2. The right to exercise a limited control over other people's access to your child's education records.
3. The right to seek to correct your child's educational records, in a hearing, if necessary.
4. The right to file a complaint with the United States Department of Education, Washington, DC, if we should fail to comply with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act regulations.

B. Penalties

Persons who violate this code shall be subject to the following penalties:

1. Visitors. Their authorization, if any, to remain on school grounds or at the school function shall be withdrawn and they shall be directed to leave the premises. If they refuse to leave, they shall be subject to ejection.
2. Students. They shall be subject to disciplinary action as the facts may warrant, in accordance with the due process requirements.
3. Tenured faculty members. They shall be subject to disciplinary action as the facts may warrant in accordance with Education Law § 3020-a or any other legal rights that they may have.
4. Staff members in the classified service of the civil service entitled to the protection of Civil Service Law § 75. They shall be subject to immediate ejection and to disciplinary action as the facts may warrant in accordance with Civil Service Law § 75 or any other legal rights that they may have.
5. Staff members other than those described in subdivisions 3 and 4. They shall be subject to warning, reprimand, suspension or dismissal as the facts may warrant in accordance with any legal rights they may have.

C. Enforcement

The Principal or his/her designee shall be responsible for enforcing the conduct required by this code.

When the Principal or his or her designee sees an individual engaged in prohibited conduct, which in his or her judgment does not pose any immediate threat of injury to persons or property, the Principal or designee shall tell the individual that the conduct is prohibited and attempt to persuade the individual to stop. The Principal or designee shall also warn the individual of the consequences for failing to stop. If the person refuses to stop engaging in the prohibited conduct, or if the person's conduct poses an immediate threat of injury to persons or property, the Principal or designee shall have the individual removed immediately from school property or the school function. If necessary, local law enforcement authorities will be contacted to assist in removing the person.

The district shall initiate disciplinary action against any student or staff member, as appropriate, with the "Penalties" section above. In addition, the district reserves its right to pursue a civil or criminal legal action against any person violating the code.

Requirements For School Attendance

In accordance with the NYS Education Department Guidelines, students in grades K, 2, 4, 7, and 10, are required to have a physical exam as well as all students participating in sports. Also, all new students entering the district must have a physical on file. A form is available from the school nurse if you choose to have your child's physical at your primary care physician. If your child has not received an examination by their own physician, they will have the exam completed by our school physician during the course of the school year. Health screenings which include height, weight, vision, and hearing will be completed by the school nurse in grades K-5, 7 and 10 and at the request of a parent or teacher during the school year. Scoliosis screening will be done annually on all students in grades 4-10. Attendance: All children absent from school must submit a written excuse upon return.

POLICY- 3410 CODE OF CONDUCT ON SCHOOL PROPERTY

The district is committed to providing an orderly, respectful environment that is conducive to learning. To create and maintain this kind of an environment, it is necessary to regulate public conduct on school property and at school functions. For purposes of this section of the code, "public" shall mean all persons when on school property or attending a school function including students, teachers and district personnel. The restrictions on public conduct on school property and at school functions contained in this code are not intended to limit freedom of speech or peaceful assembly. The district recognizes that free inquiry and free expression are indispensable to the objectives of the district. The purpose of this code is to maintain public order and prevent abuse of the rights of others. All persons on school property or attending a school function shall conduct themselves in a respectful and orderly manner. In addition, all persons on school property or attending a school function are expected to be properly attired for the purpose they are on school property.

A. Prohibited Conduct

No person, either alone or with others, shall:

- Intentionally injure any person or threaten to do so.
- Intentionally damage or destroy school district property or the personal property of a teacher, administrator, other district employee or any person lawfully on school property, including graffiti or arson.
- Disrupt the orderly conduct of classes, school programs or other school activities.
- Distribute or wear materials on school grounds or at school functions that are obscene, advocate illegal action, appear libelous, obstruct the rights of others, or are disruptive to the school program.
- Intimidate, harass or discriminate against any person on the basis of actual or perceived race, creed, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sex, sexual orientation, or gender (including gender identity and expression).
- Enter any portion of the school premises without authorization or remain in any building or facility after it is normally closed.
- Obstruct the free movement of any person in any place to which this code applies.
- Violate the traffic laws, parking regulations or other restrictions on vehicles.
- Possess, consume, sell, offer, manufacture, distribute or exchange alcoholic beverages, controlled or illegal substances or any synthetic versions (whether or not specifically illegal or labeled for human consumption), or be under the influence of either on school property or at a school function
- Possess or use weapons in or on school property or at a school function, except in the case of law enforcement officers or except as specifically authorized by the school district.
- Loiter on or about school property.
- Gamble on school property or at school functions.
- Refuse to comply with any reasonable order of identifiable school district officials performing their duties.
- Willfully incite others to commit any of the acts prohibited by this code.
- Violate any federal or state statute, local ordinance or Board policy while on school property or while at a school function.



Health Services

Medication During School Hours

According to New York State Education Law 257, Mandated Procedure: All medication orders must be renewed ANNUALLY. This applies to a change in medication, as well as updated dosages. Furthermore, an adult must deliver all medications to the school in the original container. All medications, prescription or non-prescription must be accompanied by a written prescription to the school nurse from the doctor and permission by the parent to administer the medication. The pharmacy label is not a sufficient order and cannot be used in lieu of a written order from a licensed prescriber. All medication MUST be provided by the guardian/parent. We are sure you can understand that this procedure is designed to protect the child, the parent, and the school, and we hope in the event that your child must take medication during school hours, that you will cooperate with us. (Forms are available at the school.)

Please be advised if your child has a temperature of 100 degrees, and/or is vomiting, the child will need to be picked up from school and the child should not return to school until he/she is 24 hours free of temperature or vomiting. Hadley-Luzerne will be required to report Body Mass Index (BMI) information to the New York State Department of Health unless a waiver is signed and returned to the school nurse.
