

<b>Kindergarten and Grade 1</b>	<p><b>W.K.6</b> With guidance and support from adults, explore a variety of <b>digital tools</b> to <i>produce</i> and <i>publish</i> writing, including in <i>collaboration</i> with peers.</p> <p><b>SL.K.2</b> Confirm understanding of a text read aloud or information presented orally or through <b>other media</b> by asking and answering questions about key details and requesting clarification if something is not understood.</p>

Grade 5

Grades 9 – 10
