Over 700 FCCLA high school members took part in the FCCLA Leadership Academy, which offers curated lessons to students by grade level and is specific to relevant lessons in life, career, and college readiness. The academy uses the FranklinCovey *Leader in Me* curriculum to empower students to develop their leadership skills and self-confidence while learning side-by-side with peers from across the country. This in-depth training at

To advance to the national level, members must first compete and place at the district and state levels. Over 4,700 FCCLA members competed in national STAR (Students Taking Action with Recognition) Events, in which members earn recognition for their proficiency and achievement in chapter and individual projects, leadership skills and career preparation. Students develop real-world, employable skills through STAR Events, which enhance the classroom experience. The competitions include areas such as Early Childhood Education, Sports Nutrition, Entrepreneurship, Fashion Design, Job Interview and Culinary Arts.

This year's annual conference was the largest conference in FCCLA history, with more than 8,700 advisors, members, alumni and guests. They attended leadership and program trainings, heard national speakers, competed in events, and explored college and career opportunities. FCCLA is a student organization that helps young men and women become leaders and address important personal, family, work, and societal issues through Family and Consumer Sciences education. FCCLA has over 175,000 members and more than 5,300 chapters from 50 state associations, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.
