



2018-2019 *SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION PACKET*

Friends of Jennings School District Foundation 501(c)(3)

The Friends of Jennings School District Foundation 501(c)(3) was formed in 2013 as a nonprofit organization comprised of community board members. The Foundation's main purpose is to support student scholarships and district activities for youth.

In recognition of academic excellence and leadership, the Friends of Jennings School District Foundation will award at least six scholarships for a value of at least \$1000 to graduating seniors payable to the students' college or university of choice. Scholarship recipients will be announced at the 2019 Friends of Jennings School District Scholarships & Awards Gala.

Thanks to additional funding from Jennings School District alumni and partners, at least one student will receive the *Hidden Warrior Scholarship* for \$1,000 or more pending funding.

SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES

1. Availability

These scholarships offered through the Friends of Jennings School District Foundation are a one-time scholarship to be used the following school year.

2. Eligibility

Applicants must have a 2.5 or higher GPA, actively participate in school, and maintained a 93-100% attendance rate during four years of high school. To qualify for scholarship funds, applicants must provide evidence they have been accepted into a two- or four-year college/university or technical post-secondary institution. Students must be a resident of the Jennings School District. Students are not eligible if they receive or accept a full tuition scholarship or a military academy appointment.

The following items must be submitted with the scholarship application:

- a. Transcript.
- b. Two letters of recommendation from a school coach, club sponsor, administrator or active.
- c. Attach a typed essay (not to exceed one page, single spaced) describing activities you have been involved with during the past four years including any awards/honors you have received. The essay must also include your future education plans and goals towards a degree.

3. Application Deadline

Applications must be postmarked by March 15, 2019.

4. Selection Process

A committee will be formed to review scholarship applications and select recipients. Scholarships will be awarded without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, ancestry, disability, age, genetic information or any other characteristic protected by law. Selection will be based on the "whole person" concept. Individual accomplishments and school activities will be considered as well as scholastic performance. All decisions by the scholarship committee are final.
