

Knob Noster Public Schools Selects Todd Misenhelter as New High School History Teacher



Knob Noster Public Schools has selected Mr. Todd Misenhelter to serve as Knob Noster High School History Teacher for the 2017-2018 school year. He will also be coaching Football and Track.

Mr. Misenhelter is returning to Knob Noster from Smithville High School, which has a tradition of excellence in both academics and athletics. Originally from Smithville, Mo., he attended college at MidAmerica Nazarene University, where he was a football player during the 2008-2012 seasons, becoming a 1st team All-American offensive lineman. He started his teaching career here at Knob Noster High School in 2013 and taught here for two years. He taught Western Civilizations, Psychology, Sociology, and Government in that time. In 2015, he was offered the opportunity to teach and coach in his hometown of Smithville, MO. While there, he taught Criminal Justice, Psychology, History through Film, and Contemporary Issues. At both schools, Misenhelter was a senior class sponsor and organized graduation. Coaching at Smithville, Misenhelter was a part of a 9-2 season in 2015 and an 8-3 season in 2016.

Mr. Misenhelter stated, “There were quite a few influencing factors going into my decision to return. I missed being a part of a close-knit teaching staff of a smaller school district where you know all of the students. I also wanted to be closer to my family again. My mother has been diagnosed with Stage four small cell carcinoma, and being any bit closer helps. I believe that my knowledge and experience with the school district and community will help me be the best teacher for the students of Knob Noster. I am excited to bring back all that I’ve learned and ready to rejoin all of the great people at Knob Noster.”
