Parents Right-to-Know Procedures

The Lawrence County Public School System desires to maintain strong communication and a cooperative effort between home and school. We are committed to providing your child with a quality education. One of the keys in accomplishing this is to ensure that our teaching personnel are caring and well qualified.

The Lawrence County Schools will notify parents, at the beginning of each academic year, by letter or notice sent home to parents. Notice may include but not limited to, website, school-cast, and materials sent through students. This letter or notice will inform parents of their right to request information regarding the professional qualification of their child's teacher.

Upon written request to the school principal, our school system will provide information, to the legal guardian, in a timely manner, which specifies the professional qualifications of the child's current classroom teacher(s) or the qualifications of any paraprofessional who is directly involved in the instruction of that child.

Additionally, schools receiving Title I funds will provide parents the following information:

*** Specific information regarding the child's level of achievement as reflected on the most current state academic assessments.

***A timely notice, when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four consecutive weeks by a core teacher who is not highly qualified.

The notice and information provided to parents shall be in an understandable and uniform format and to the extent practicable in a language that parents can understand.
