Superintendent's Comments:

General remarks

We have had a pretty rocky summer to get us to the point of starting school. While many people vary on their approach to masks, the Liberty School Board felt they had no choice but to approve a plan that follows the Governor's Executive Order of masks being mandated for indoors. We had several visitors speak on this. The school board always appreciates hearing from their community and having people take an active role in the school district by attending the school board meetings. Please continue to be involved. Also, any support you can give staff and board members is greatly appreciated. Many times it can be a very thankless job.

Consent Agenda

Routinely, at this time of year, a tentative budget is presented and approved. After thirty days, the budget becomes the proposed budget for the 2021-22 school year. The EIS Report due every year at this time is approved and posted on our web-site. It confirms what staff were paid in the previous school year. The 2nd reading of PRESS Policy and approval occurred. A new garbage contract was approved, causing the District to contract with Republic rather than Area. A bid for a new caged area for volleyball and PE equipment along with concession stand food items was approved from NMC General Contracting. Finally, admissions gate prices were changed due to not offering a season ticket, just in case our sport seasons are impacted by COVID again. We hope there will be no issues, but anything is possible, so we have seen these past few weeks.

Other

A discussion took place on how to handle students coming to school unmasked. As much as we hope this will not be the case, we must have a plan of action. Details will be shared on social media. In the end, I believe with all my heart that the Liberty community will stand strong and work with the school. This community always comes together during tough times. So, why not now? We are not against the parent group who would like masks optional. As a matter of fact, the board members agree with most of their points, but know we must follow the current guidelines of the Governor, ISBE, and IDPH. Please keep our school community in your thoughts as we try to move forward and get back to what schools were meant to be about—teaching and learning!
