# **Superintendent's Comments:**

#### Budget

This month is when we propose the tentative amended budget if necessary for the current fiscal year. We also look ahead to begin working on the budget for the next fiscal year.

## **Summer School**

This year summer school is being offered to all students K-12<sup>th</sup> grade who may need extra help. We want to close the learning gap that COVID may have created, as well as help students make more progress and become proficient in reading and math. Also, we want students to receive special education services so there is no regression this summer.

## **Agreements & Policies**

We typically renew all our agreements at this meeting, along with accepting milk bids. We are having the second reading of three policies and then approving them.

## **Getting ready for next year!**

The board meeting schedule for July 2021-June 2022 has been set and approved. The sponsor list is approved, so we have everything in place for a new season of sports, even though the pandemic has caused spring sports to continue into the summer.

#### Two new items

We have decided to renovate the high school office and reorganize our space. As a result, the counselor is moving into the high school office and the teacher lunchroom and copy machine will be relocated. This move will allow another classroom to be available for the teachers and students. This change will also provide more space to test students and work with them in the morning and afternoon; outside of the lunch time.

#### **Vocational classes**

The Programs/ Curriculum/ Student Services Committee has invited the school board to consider ways offset the cost for students who take vocational classes at the Quincy Area Vocational Technical Center. Liberty is a member of this center and could have students take courses that are not offered at our campus, such as diesel mechanics, CNA, graphic arts, and computer aided design. A wonderful power point on the different programs offered and interest data were presented to the school board. The committee just wants to find a way for more students to be able to participate.
