  - provide opportunities for students to set goals in all subjects each quarter
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:**
  - during first semester in grades 3-5 (partnership conferences) in October and November
- 3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their child's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:**
  - progress reports the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> week of each quarter- report cards after ten weeks

- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in the school:**
  - PTA events, school events, school celebrations (Awards ceremonies, etc.), community service projects adopted by the school, eat lunch with students, attend classroom functions (guest speakers, parties), field trips, serve on principal committees when called upon, sponsor and assist with clubs, etc.

- supply my child with appropriate school supplies
- be responsible for my child's punctuality and school attendance
- support discipline policies of the classroom and school and assist in decisions relating to my child
- maintain a time and place for homework and review it
