### Areas of Strengths:

Results from the AdvancedED Self-Assessment for North Mobile County Mobile County K-8 has determined Standard One to be an area of strength. The school's mission has a clear and deliberate focus to maximize the success of all students as evidence by the alignment of the continuous improvement plan and the school system's strategic plan. Evidence collected as part of the self-assessment process, further suggests that North Mobile County K-8 continuous improvement planning process for review, revisions and communication of the purpose statement is documented in a formalized process and is implemented on a regular basis. A large amount of evidence exists documenting two-way communication with stake holders. Meeting agendas, newsletters, the website, and handbooks further suggest evidence of a process that includes all stakeholders.

### Actions to Sustain the Area of Strength

North Mobile County K-8 School will continue to engage all stakeholders on a regular basis when reviewing and revising the comprehensive improvement plan. North Mobile County K-8 School will continue to reflect on the programs and equitable learning experiences and to insure that they are implemented so that all students learn and achieve. The staff at North Mobile County K-8 School will continue to put an emphasis on high expectations for staff and students.

### Actions of Improvement:

Communication at North Mobile County K-8 School can be viewed as a strength and a weakness. Although the school communicates information in a variety of ways, such as monthly newsletters, text messages, school messenger, and quarterly parent meetings, more stakeholder input could be established. Stakeholders could be given more opportunities to express their concerns about activities so that they will have more ownership in the school. Exploring other venues of communication such as social media that reach stakeholders will also be explored. Lines of communication among all stakeholders will be reviewed, so everyone feels that they are contributing to making North

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Mobile County K-8 School a school of excellence, where students engage in multiple pathways that lead to success in a global society.

Actions to Improve areas in Need of Improvement:

North Mobile County K-8 School understands that effective communication is essential to effective leadership and will incorporate a plan to improve stakeholder communication and input. The plan will include more opportunities to meet with stakeholders. This will provide opportunities to develop strategies, provide assistance and plans that will improve North Mobile County K-8 school.

Areas of Strengths:

Results from the AdvancedEd Self -Assessment for North Mobile County K-8 has determined that Standard Two to be an area of strength. The school system has clear and established policies and procedures. These policies and procedures are communicated and implemented at North Mobile County K-8 School. Evidence collected as part of the self- assessment can be found through various school handbooks and a variety of forms of communication from the school. Meeting agendas and sign in sheets further provide evidence of the policies and

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procedures that are implemented at North Mobile County K-8 School.

### Actions to Sustain the Areas of Strength:

North Mobile County K-8 School will continue to promote and implement policies and procedures provided by the governing body through the day-to-day operations of the school. North Mobile County K-8 School will continue to review and revise the continuous improvement plan in making decisions for the school in all areas. After reviewing the state test scores, the continuous improvement plan committee determined that additional resources were needed for math and reading. Evidence can be found in the last two years continuous improvement plan of the goals and the money allocated to purchase these materials. Lastly, North Mobile County K-8 is committed to identifying goals and strategies for the improvement of achievement.

### Areas of Improvement:

North Mobile County K-8 School can improve in the area of professional development. Many curriculum changes have occurred in the past couple of years. Usually a brief training is done prior to the implementation. Follow up training sessions need to occur on a regular basis once the teachers have had some time to implement the programs. Peer coaching and instructional rounds will occur to facilitate this process. The administrative staff also needs to be trained continuously in these programs, so they will have adequate knowledge to ensure that the programs are being implemented to fidelity.

.Advance Ed Self - Assessment Standard 3: Teaching and Assessing for Learning

### Area of Strengths:

North Mobile County K- 8 School has identified Standard Three as a strength, although there are some areas that scored a two. Evidence indicates that the purpose and direction of North Mobile County K-8 school is aligned to the district's Strategic Plan and our local Continuous Improvement Plan. Curriculum is provided by the district and is implemented at the local school level. The curriculum and the academic success of students is monitored and adjusted as needed. The student's grades are sent home to the guardians every three weeks and parents are given the access code to check grades online twice a year. North Mobile has placed an emphasis on the availability and use of technology in the classrooms with the purchase of a large number of computers and tablets in the past two years. The administration completes classroom observations regularly and provides frequent professional development. Mentoring programs are in place for new teachers and teachers that are struggling.

### Actions to Sustain the Areas of Strength:

To sustain our areas of strength, North Mobile County K-8 School will continue to make additional technology in the classrooms available to the students on a daily basis. Staff professional development will be ongoing in all areas of curriculum. STEM has become a focus in the last year and it will continue to be incorporated in instructional practice. The mentoring program will continue for the new teachers and will include instructional rounds among the teachers.

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### Areas of improvement:

One area of improvement for North Mobile County K-8 School, will be the functioning of professional learning communities. Since we have very few teachers per grade level on the elementary level and the middle school only has one teacher for some subject areas, it has been difficult to incorporate professional learning communities successfully.

### Actions to Improve Areas in Need of Support:

The action that North Mobile County K-8 School will do to support this area of need will be to find an area of professional learning that will apply to the entire staff. The administration will then make sure that time is created for professional development and that the strategies taught are implemented.

.Advance Ed Self - Assessment Standard 4: Resources and Support Systems

### Area of Strengths:

North Mobile County K- 8 School has identified Standard Four as an area of strength. Evidence indicates that the purpose and direction of North Mobile County K-8 school is aligned to the district's Strategic Plan and our local Continuous Improvement Plan. System policies and processes for obtaining professional and support staff are in place and followed at North Mobile County Public School. The school leader allocates Title One money to fund two paraprofessionals for the school. The instructional time, materials and resources are focused on supporting the purpose and direction of the school. A plethora of evidence is provided documenting the expectation of safety, cleanliness and a healthy environment. This includes maintenance requests, custodial schedules and documentation of drills and emergency procedures. At North Mobile County K-8 the technology infrastructure has been an area of focus for the past two years. The addition of an elementary computer lab, along with paraprofessional that works in that computer has occurred this year. In addition, North Mobile County K-8 has purchased a large amount of computers, teacher laptops and iPads for the classrooms. North Mobile County K-8 School has a variety of services that meet the physical, social and emotional needs of our students as evidenced by the counseling services provided by the school counselor as well as the contract services by Alta Pointe, the Drug Education Foundation, Penelope House and Crittenton Youth Services. Students are monitored on a monthly grade level meetings through academics and behavior. In this meeting, possible interventions and their success are discussed, as well as any additional services that may be needed to support the success of the student.

### Actions to Sustain the Areas of Strength:

To sustain our areas of strength, North Mobile County K-8 will continue to make additional technology in the classrooms available to the students on a daily basis. Staff professional development will be ongoing in the area of technology. Safety drills and a review of the safety plan will continue on a regular basis. North Mobile County K-8 will continue to provide services that include our counselor and contract services to meet the social and emotional needs of our students.

### Areas of improvement:

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North Mobile County K-8 has noticed a trend of students needing more services that require emotional and social needs. Many of the guardians come to the school requesting assistance with situations that are not of an academic nature. North Mobile County K-8 is in a rural area that covers more than 50 miles and many of our families do not have transportation or internet service. An area that we hope to improve will be providing guardians with information and support services that will help them address their needs.

Actions to Improve Areas in Need of Support:

The action that North Mobile County K-8 will do to support this area of need will be to work with supporting agencies and have more parent and school activities to address the needs of the families. This will allow us to engage not only the parents as stakeholders, but also the community support services that are available.

Area of Strengths:

North Mobile County K- 8 School has identified Standard five as a strength. Evidence indicates North Mobile County K-8 School uses data to make adjustments to instruction and the local Continuous Improvement Plan. The school staff maintains and uses a variety of assessments

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that are provided by the system as well as ones that are created by the teachers. Data is frequently reviewed school wide, on grade level and by individual teachers. North Mobile County administers the Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) assessment in reading and math, monthly to all students. This data, as well as other assessments and work samples, are reviewed in monthly meetings to discuss students' needs and the needed changes in instruction. The data is shared with stakeholders on a frequent basis through conferences, report cards and progress reports.

Actions to Sustain the Areas of Strength:

To sustain our areas of strength, North Mobile County K-8 School will continue to use a variety of assessments. Stakeholders will continue to receive information regarding student achievement and activities that support student learning. The administration will continue to monitor the data and make adjustment as need to improve student achievement.

Areas of improvement:

One area of improvement, for North Mobile County K-8 School will need to improve is to make sure that students are aware of their personal data on assessments. Although scores are shared with students, they are often only told the score and not made aware of specific objectives that they need to improve, nor are they told strategies they could use to improve their performance.

Actions to Improve Areas in Need of Support:

North Mobile County K- 8 School will have time set aside to review scores individually with students on major assessments and assignments. Teachers will discuss individually with the students the mistakes that were made and strategies they need to correct them, Teachers will have to provide documentation to the administration and this will be used as data is reviewed.
