## Goal 1

Focus on student success and achievement level through effective guidance, curriculum alignment with content standards, sound teaching methods, and consistency in the application of school policy to insure all students are challenged individually and collectively to meet more rigorous standards.

## **Measures**

The MSD of New Durham Township overarching vision is to ensure all students enter college, trade school, or military after completing high school. Our goal is to increase the number of Westville High School graduates earning post-secondary degrees or certificates within five years after graduation. Indicators for the following benchmarks are based NWEA, ISTEP, IREAD, ECA, and SAT Assessments. Disaggregated scores are in Appendix A and are essential to achieving the goals of this plan. In some cases, year one occurs in the 2017-2018 school year and will establish the baseline metric.
