Public Hearings/ High School Robotics teacher Brian Leopold introduced the Robotics team.

Mr. Leopold reported the team is young and still won second overall at a recent Nashville competition and will be traveling to Alabama in December for the "Super Bowl of Robotics". The team's saying is "leave no doubt". The Board wished the Robotics team the best and congratulated them on their accomplishments to this point.

There was not a PTO rep available for an update.

Report of Committees

<u>Building Committee</u> – Chairman Martin reported the committee discussed the progress of the new maintenance facility, with the concrete poured, electrical and plumbing is roughed in, but awaiting the delivery of the steel structure. The new transportation facility was discussed as well and other small things at the school level.

<u>Finance Committee</u> – President Stauffenberg reported the committee met prior to this meeting and discussed the following:

- 1. Building projects (transportation center and maintenance facility)
- 2. Snow plowing and salt bids
- 3. Overview from Dawn and Kathy as to what accounts can be used for running a business.
- 4. State funding Money could be hard to come by next year.

Member Dodge commented on the \$12,000 received for used High School textbooks.

<u>Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Committee</u> – Josh Ruland reported the committee met and discussed digital classrooms. Many school districts are moving away from textbooks and toward technology based instruction. Manteno is considering a one – one laptop based program. The students on the committee stated that homework not counted for a grade prevented the final grade from being raised or "padded". Reinforced learning and prevented accumulation of points to increase grades. Grades are more reflective of understanding and learning. Finished the curriculum and textbook review cycle non-core. There was an update on the curriculum evaluation with the reading series. Teachers would like to speak with other schools that are currently using the reading series Manteno is piloting. The District Improvement Plan revisions will be discussed at the next meeting.

<u>Technology Committee</u> – Member Toepper reported the District received a Secure Our Schools grant written with the Manteno Police Dept. providing about \$165,000 with the District providing an equal match to install video surveillance in each building. It was reminded the responsibility of the Tech Committee members is to solicit input from building staff to present at the meeting as well as taking information back from the meeting to the building staff. Also discussed the idea of digital classrooms and the one to one computer to student ratio in the future. The staff buy program was also discussed.
