Comments

Carolyn Johnson, Middle School Spelling Coach introduced Charlie Massie, the Manteno Middle School champion speller, who received a second at the I-Kan contest on March  $6^{th}$ . The Board congratulated Ms. Johnson and Charlie for his accomplishments.

Tim VanSwol introduced Diane Rewerts, Middle School volleyball coach, who in turn introduced the 7<sup>th</sup> grade volleyball team and coaches, who were Kan-Will Champs, and made it to the Elite Eight at the State level, with a final record of 25 and 2. The Board congratulated the team and coaches.

Tim VanSwol also introduced Middle School Wrestling coach, Larry George and wrestler Sam Myers (Kevin Gerst was absent). Kevin Gerst was most improved wrestler and State qualifier. Sam Myers was a State qualifier, with a third place at Sectionals and also a State tournament participant.

High School Principal, Paul Russert, introduced John Quinn, AT&T Director of External Affairs, who presented the Operation Teen Safe Driving Club ("A Team") a check for \$500 to apply to the afterschool program. The Club has recently received 180 pledges of students vowing not to text and drive. A seatbelt survey has been completed numerous times, with more and more students and staff wearing their seatbelts. The program is working!

Mike Casagrande, PTO President, reported April 2<sup>nd</sup> and April 3<sup>rd</sup> are Berkots "Community Involvement Days", in which a percentage of sales will be donated to Marilyn Cordes' reading program. The magazine sales are complete and approximately \$3,500 was raised to assist in the purchase of choral risers. Baker's Square "Pie Night" is April 16<sup>th</sup>, in which a portion of the proceeds will be donated back to the PTO. Elections are coming up in May and there are two vacant positions (Vice President of the Elementary School and Vice President of the High School). Mr. Casagrande is looking for people to step up into these positions. Reports of Committees Building Committee – Gary Preston reported the budget is in good shape with regards to the gas and electricity budgets, so the maintenance department will look at pricing some much needed items, such as a bucket truck and replace the old tractor. It was agreed to hire at least six student summer maintenance employees, but not more than ten. The track resurfacing will take place this summer. There are issues at the Elementary School with crumbling sidewalks. Mr. DePoister will be gathering repair ideas to present back to the committee.

**Finance Committee** – Patrick Mallaney reported they met at 5:00 tonight. A recommendation was made to accept the donation from the Manteno Intramural Basketball program for a new scoreboard controller. It was also agreed to accept bid packets 2A thru 16A, as well as switch the District's life for staff to Harleysville from Met Life at renewal time. It was also agreed to adopt a Golf/Utility written policy, and to participate in the consolidated energy program. The last recommendation was to return the transitory impact fee as discussed.

<u>Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Committee</u> – Joshua Ruland reported the Public Library will celebrate National Library Month with hosting an open house on April 12<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m., a new art club for all ages will begin on April 24<sup>th</sup>, a creative writing class will begin on April 28<sup>th</sup> for 5<sup>th</sup> thru 8<sup>th</sup> graders, the annual art show for middle and high school students will be held at the end of April, and the "Tot Spot" program has been very successful. There was an overview of Google Apps/Panthernation. There was a spirited conversation regarding the application and requirements of the Race to the Top grant. Teachers are willing to write their own curriculum and there is encouragement for finding ways to do such. The Kahn Academy was discussed, as well as free webinars on Common Core Standards from Pearson and the 1:1 initiative. An update on the formation of the Writing Team found the search for building team leaders.

**Technology Committee** – Tom Steele reported he attended the Skyward Conference in Florida (paid for by the Skyward Steering Committee), and he learned of a lot of new features. The most exciting is the release of a video game that will be part of "Student Access". It is supposed to tie in to PBIS and similar initiatives to help reinforce positive behavior. It is still in the testing phase, but should be coming out with demos soon. Google Apps Single Sign On – there is a glitch when using Internet Explorer. We will push staff and students to use Chrome or Firefox with using Google Apps. Dan has been working laboriously on this project. A touch screen computer, external keypunch and electronic cash drawer were purchased as a pilot for improving lunch room efficiency and have been recently installed at the Middle School. We will likely purchase several more for use in other buildings. The tech intern search for 2012-13 was discussed with hopes to interview in April. There is new baseball scoring software that Brent Zhorne has been

using called GameChanger. It's an app for the iPad that allows stats to be entered and updates in real-time to the Internet where it is visible to the public.
