Kassie Krause, Manteno Magic Show Choir director, spoke to the Board regarding their request to attend the 2012 National Show Choir completion in New York City during the 2012 spring break. There will be no cost to the District; the Show Choir Boosters will be fundraising for the entire costs.

Dave Conrad and Randy Fortin gave an update on the Middle School Military Fundraiser, which at the conclusion of the effort rose over \$6,000 and collected over 6,000 supply items for American troops stationed in Afghanistan.

<u>Building Committee</u> – Gary Preston reported the Primary School was the main focus of discussion. The roof recoating will have to be done due to a lot of leaks. Some signage is needed at the ball parks for "park at your own risk".

<u>Finance Committee</u> – Chairman Mallaney reported the committee reviewed the finance packet, and were updated on the State revenue status. The bids were reviewed for the Primary and High School roof recoating projects. The video surveillance equipment project was discussed, as well as the 50% reimbursement as determined by the Village of Manteno. There was an impact fee update.

<u>Curriculum Committee</u> – Josh Ruland reported the committee discussed Standards-Based reporting in relation to learning targets, grading practices and behavior and academic reporting. Tricia Weber demonstrated the Aimsweb math administration in the area of M-CAP. The last item discussed was Scholastic Reading Counts tests will now be able to be taken from remote locations (i.e. home, public library, etc.) Fidelity and tightening a secure location, such as a few computers at the High School is being explored. The challenge at this point, is the education with staff and students on how to use appropriately. It is at the beginning stages.

<u>Technology Committee</u> – Tom Steele reported the committee met on April 12th and discussed the Google Apps project. More volunteers are needed. The private cloud/server project was discussed with reps. The good news is the prices are much more reasonable than the original pricing. The tech intern search has had seven sophomore interns apply, of which two will be hired. Along with the Village of Manteno, we are soliciting bids for the Phase III of the CCTV project to add up to 63 additional cameras, an additional NVR and more storage. The bids came in all below budget. There has been an iPad demonstration offer from Crescent City Grade School

who received a grant and they have 19 iPads on a mobile cart that they use amongst the classes. We will be taking up their offer and Randy Fortin will follow up.
