| Public Hearings | Rae Skidmore, spokesperson for the PTO reported that the last Market Day pick up will be June 9 th at the Elementary School. PTO officers for the 2006-2007 school year have been elected. Popsicles were given to all students for the end of the year treats. School supply orders and PTO membership forms were disbursed with the registration packets. |
| | Paul Russert reported that the Dralle Perfect Attendance drawing will be held on June 7 th at 6:30 p.m. at the Peotone Atrium. There are approximately 60 Manteno High School students eligible for the new car being donated by Dralle Chevrolet Buick. |

| Report of Committees | <u>Building Committee</u> – Chairperson Sam Martin reviewed the minutes of the May 16 th meeting. Bids were reviewed from several local contractors for demolition and concrete work and it is the Committee's recommendation to approve the combined |

bids of Kevin Nugent Construction for both the Middle School and High School for said work. It was also recommended to move forward with the ordering of a fob entry door for Middle School entrance #10 for safety and convenience during construction at a cost of \$1,845.69.

<u>Finance Committee</u> – Member Nelson reported that the bus lease was discussed at the meeting held May 16^{th} . At that time it was the recommendation of the committee to accept the 3 year lease agreement with Midwest Transit Equipment with the maintenance option for all buses with the exception of the 21 passenger bus (1 year lease due to high volume of mileage) for a cost of \$265,343. After further review, it was determined that there would be an interest charge in the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} year of the lease which would total \$105,428. There fore it is the recommendation of the District Office that we approve a one year lease with Midwest Transit for 22 buses with no maintenance agreement.

<u>Curriculum and Technology Committee</u> – Tom Steele and Gale Dodge highlighted the minutes of the May 11th meeting. There are Smart Board/ActivBoards available for teacher's use at the High School and Middle School. The Boards are being considered as part of the new construction purchases. Scantron testing will be complete next week. Grade book demos were discussed. The HelpBox is back on line. The Homework Hotline future is uncertain. There are considerations regarding the grade book, Share Point and concerns with Kindergarten grading only a few times during the year. Microsoft is coming out with two products to replace Front Page. We will not abandon Frontpage until a suitable replacement has been found and training offered. The end of year procedures was outlined. The phone system replacement strategy was discussed while soliciting estimates from CNG, TIG and CDWG. At this point, they are not making a recommendation on a vendor, but rather a solution. The make up of the 2006-2007 Committee was voted upon.
