Meeting of the Governing Board January 27, 2016

OPENING

Call to Order

President Coutré called a meeting of the Maricopa Unified School District No. 20 Governing Board to order at 6:31 p.m. in the Board Room at the District Office Administration Building.

Roll call reflected the following members:

Pledge of Allegiance

Mrs. Anderson led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Adoption of Agenda

Mrs. Anderson motioned to approve the agenda with the amendment of moving item 5A from Information/Work Study to right before Call to the Public. Dr. Miller seconded. Motion passed 4/0.

Saddleback Elementary School Academic Focus Update

Mrs. Felicia Williams, Principal presented Saddleback Elementary Schools academic focus being a 21st Century Learning Academy. Mrs. Williams explained the three main areas of focus for the students are critical thinking, problem solving and collaboration; creativity, innovation, leadership and positive behavior management; and digital citizenship and technology understanding. Mrs. Williams introduced the following teachers from each of the grade levels to present how they incorporate 21st Century Learning into each of the classrooms instruction, Mrs. Pat Wilson, Pre-school teacher; Mrs. Yurosha Rastad, Kindergarten teacher; Ms. Sue Swanno, 1st grade teacher; Ms. Marci Hoellwarth, 2nd grade teacher; Ms. Tanya Nielsen, 3rd grade teacher; Ms. Brandi Howell, 4th grade teacher; Mrs. Christina Sorenson, 5th grade teacher; Mr. Kevin Connell, 6th grade teacher. The common challenges each of the grade levels face is the lack of technology help, lack of district technology and training, low bandwidth, number of Chromebooks, lack of subscriptions to educational websites, and large class sizes. Dr. Marchelle Hasan, TOSA spoke about the after school 21st Century tutoring program and how it aligns to Saddleback's academic focus by providing math and reading help to students four days a week. Mrs. Jane Tift, Academic Coach explained she works with the teachers to implement the shifts in teaching and learning that have come along with College and Career Readiness Standards. Mrs. Tift explained the challenge is the time for teachers to implement new teaching strategies, reflect on them, and readjust their teaching along with the technology being unreliable.

Mrs. Anderson asked how many students are in the 21st Century afterschool program and Mrs. Williams answered they can have up to 120 students, but currently have 96 students. Mrs. Williams also explained the funding for this afterschool program is the result of a 5 year grant the school has been awarded and Saddleback is currently in year 2 of that grant. Dr. Miller questioned if there is a wait list for the after school program and is their certain grades that fill up quicker than others. Mrs. Williams answered that there is a wait list as they try not to put more than 15 students per grade in a classroom so it will be beneficial to those students. Mrs. Williams also explained the grades that fill up quicker than others would be 1st and 6th grades.

Call to the Public

Mr. Darryl Gooden from Keeping Teachers Teaching Foundation addressed the Board to inform every one of his organization that supports teachers that fall into hardships. Mr. Gooden announced a Health and Wellness Walk on April 30th in Phoenix and Mr. Gooden also said there will be bowling tournament where Butterfield Elementary School has been invited to participate. Mr. Gooden explained information on this project and events will be sent out to the students, parents and community in the coming weeks.

Mrs. Karie Russell, Butterfield Elementary School teacher; Ms. Yvette Youngberg, Butterfield Elementary School teacher; Ms. Christine Dickinson, Santa Rosa teacher; Mrs. Angelia Ebner, Maricopa Elementary School teacher and Maricopa Education Association Vice President; addressed the Board in regards to the proposed changes to the 2016-17 school calendar and how this will affect teachers and staff who live outside of the City of Maricopa and that their own children attend other schools where the calendars to not match in regards to school start dates and breaks. These teachers requested that the Board table the vote and request the Board receive further feedback from all the stakeholders before making a change to the calendar.

Alyssa Hollingsworth, Maricopa High School Jr. Class President reported that the DECA group attended the DECA Regional Competition last week and won 28 medals and will be moving onto the State Competition in February. Miss Hollingsworth said on Jan 26th the high school had curriculum night for incoming freshman. The Maricopa High School Student Council is bringing back spirit Friday's where all students are encouraged to dress in school colors and student council will be attending the ASC State on Feb 4-6 where the students will be collaborating with other school student councils. Miss Hollingsworth announced the Winterguard will begin their competition season in February and running through April. Miss Hollingsworth announced a dodgeball tournament will be taking place in Maricopa High School old gym on Feb. 12th and in March there will be a spirit assembly and dance for all classes.

Dr. Chestnut attended the Maricopa Economic Development Alliance (MEDA) Board Meeting on January 20th. Dr. Chestnut reported that MEDA is working on a marketing plan for the City of Maricopa and one of the themes is public education and in particular Maricopa Unifeid School District.

Governing Board Member Activity Reports

Mrs. Anderson thanked Dr. Chestnut and the district for supporting National School Choice Week and allowing the students from the High School AP Government class to attend the rally at the State Capital on January 29th. Mrs. Anderson said this is a great opportunity for those students and she spoke to some of the high school classes this past week about it.

Dr. Miller recently visited Santa Cruz Elementary School and observed how the teachers were setting personal and academic goals with the students. Dr. Miller was very impressed with what was going on at Santa Cruz and said it was one of the best site visits he's had thus far. Dr. Miller commended Principal Dr. Conley for her enthusiasm and passion for her students. Dr. Miller announced that on Thursday, February 11th there will be the official roll out event at Pacana Park for the Vote Yes Campaign. Dr. Miller mentioned that on February 27th a team of teachers from Butterfield Elementary School will be participating in the Keep Teachers Teaching Bowling Tournament where they will have celebrity Frank Sanders, a previous Arizona Cardinals football player, bowling with them.

Mrs. Melvin gave a shout out to the Maricopa High School Girls Basketball team who was playing that night. Mrs. Melvin reported the ASBA Black Caucus has a Black History Month Education Celebration on February 6th at Balsz Community Center in Phoenix.

President Coutré met with City Manager Rose and Councilman Wade to discuss getting a task force together to target the educational needs in Maricopa. Desert Wind Middle School Academic Focus Update

Principal June Celaya presented Desert Wind Middle Schools (DWMS) academic focus being S.T.E.A.M. (Science, Technology, Arts, Engineering and Math) and is in coordination with their 20+1 Blended Learning Program. Principal Celaya introduced Mrs. Shannon Hull, 20+1 Blended Learning Teacher to speak about the 2014-15 school year when the S.T.E.A.M. focus was rolled out. Mrs. Hull explained how professional development was provided to the staff to look at what kind of projects can be used cross-curriculum. Mrs. Jennifer Szoltysik, 20+1 Blended Learning teacher presented how the 20+1 Blended Learning classroom integrates S.T.E.A.M. and the projects that the class has worked on thus far which included a toy project, shark tank, and future cities project. Student Henry McCloskey presented

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examples of the toy project, shark tank project, and future cities model and explained how the students worked on these projects. Mr. Roger Wagner, Band Teacher presented DWMS's Arts program and explained how the Arts were integrated into the future cities project by the students creating music to go with each of the cities themes. Principal Celaya says the obstacles at DWMS with the S.T.E.A.M. focus is more technology, additional professional development for all staff members in STEAM/Project Based learning technology is needed, collaboration between regular education classrooms, and expansion of the Blended Learning Program into 2 cohorts. Principal Celaya would also like to expand the partnerships with local companies and working with the Grant Committee on writing more S.T.E.A.M. grants.
