Meeting of the Governing Board November 8, 2017

OPENING

Call to Order

President Coutré called a meeting of the Maricopa Unified School District No. 20 Governing Board to order at 6:32 p.m. in the Board Room at the District Office Administration Building.

Roll call reflected the following members:

Pledge of Allegiance

Council Member Henry Wade let the Pledge of Allegiance.

Adoption of Agenda

Dr. Miller motioned to approve the agenda. Mr. Judd seconded. Motion passed 5/0.

Call to the Public

Maricopa High School DECA students Harrison Edmondson, Freya Abraham, and Adia Carr addressed the Board to inform every one of the upcoming DECA events which include Market Day on November 20th-21st and Miss Abraham explained that judges are needed for upcoming conferences and information on this is available on a flyer located on the table in the board room lobby.

Superintendent's Report

Dr. Chestnut reported on November 2nd he along with Mrs. Krista Roden, Mr. Wade Watson and Mr. Denis Cook met with the RAM Academy staff. Dr. Chestnut said two students have graduated from RAM Academy with Maricopa High School diplomas. Dr. Chestnut reported the RAM Academy building is not ready for students as of yet because they are waiting for the fire alarm system to be connected to system in the CTE building.

Dr. Chestnut said as of November 3rd an administrative update went into effect where Mr. Rick Able is Interim Principal at Maricopa High school and Mr. Thad Miller is Interim Principal at Maricopa Wells Middle School for the rest of the school year. Dr. Chestnut reported on November 7th Maricopa Wells

Dr. Chestnut reported on November 4th some of the Governing Board members and Administration staff participated in a team building exercise on the MHS adventure course.

Governing Board Member Activity Reports

Dr. Miller visited RAM Academy, Butterfield Elementary School, Maricopa Wells Middle School and the Transportation department.

Mr. Judd participated in the team building exercise on November 4th on the MHS adventure course.

Mrs. Anderson attended the first Woman's Empowerment Day on October 26th, the high school Travel Club swap meet on October 28th, the team building exercise on the MHS adventure course on November 4th, the annual Police Foundation dinner on November 4th, and the Church of Celebration prayer service for elected officials on November 5th. Mrs. Anderson will be attending the Arizona School Board Association Legislative workshop on November 17th.

Mrs. Knorr participated in the team building exercise on November 4th on the MHS adventure course and on November 7th attended an event where education was discussed with Governor Ducey.

President Coutré attended a senior night on November 1st at the high school where the HEFAR group was there to assist families with filling out the FAFSA as a free service. President Coutré also attended the last MHS football game on November 3rd, participated in the team building exercise on November 4th on the MHS adventure course, and the Church of Celebration prayer service for elected officials on November 5th. President Coutré will be attending the Arizona School Board Association Legislative workshop on November 17th.

Information Items/Work Study

MUSD's involvement with National Board Certification

Mrs. Heidi Vratil presented the National Board Certification (NBC) process. Mrs. Vratil explained that the NBC is for teachers by teachers, is the highest certification a teacher can earn in the United States and this process grows, retains teachers and recognizes the accomplishments that the teachers have. The mission of NBC is to have high and rigorous standards, to certify teachers who meet those standards and recognizes them. Mrs. Vratil said currently MUSD has 5 NBC teachers, 8 candidates waiting for final scores, 33 current candidates and 19 potential additional candidates for this year. Mrs. Vratil reported MUSD currently has a Network to Transform Teaching Grant (NT3) which provided \$70,000 for 2016-17 and 2017-18 school years. The MUSD aim with this grant is to guarantee accomplished teaching for every student in every classroom, every day. Mrs. Vratil said since this is the last school year of the grant, the ways for the district to continue to support the NBC process is for stipends, funding support for candidates, and jobembedded time. Mrs. Vratil would like to see making accomplished teaching a possible criteria for teacher leadership positions in the district.

Transportation Update

Mr. Beckett presented an update to the transportation department challenges. Mr. Beckett started off with some positive news that include stop arm cameras were installed on 10 busses, and within the past two years the district has purchased 3 new 84-passenger busses, 2 new special needs busses and 2 new white fleet shuttles. Mr. Beckett said there was a creation of a secure parts room for inventory control, installation of card readers on fuel stations, an electronic inventory and work order system (VersaTrans), and the addition of four new positions (3 drivers and 1 aide). Mr. Beckett reported the transportation department's challenges include driver recruitment; communication of late routes and the use of double routes; overcrowding concerns; and having competitive pay rates and driver recruitment & retention. Mr. Beckett said the solutions to these challenges include community input; five new full-time drivers and two substitute drivers have been hired and are currently going through training; ongoing recruitment; and a revision to the classified compensation plan.
