k. MOU- Lee University/Partnership Agreement

This MOU shall continue until June 30, 2017 and shall automatically renew for unlimited one year terms unless termination by either party prior to March 1 of the year ending term.

Mr. Blevins said a list of elementary school coaches for the 2016/17 school year was provided for the board's information.

4. COMMUNICATIONS

a. Quit Claim Deed

Mr. Blevins said according to the Quit Claim Deed we received via our attorney, Sarah Kennedy, the McMinn County Board of Education currently still owns part of the partial of land located at North City School. Mr. Blevins said back in 1976, the board deeded several partials of lots to Athens City Schools for the construction of North City School as a "good faith effort" and that somewhere in the recording process, there were two lots that were not recorded correctly. Mr. Blevins said the law office of Biddle and Trew representing Athens City Schools, prepared this quit claim deed in order to get this taken care of.

Ms. Donna Cagle asked if there was anywhere on the deed that stated who originally had given the land. Mr. Blevins stated that it did not. Ms. Cagle said her grandfather gave the land to build the school on and asked if his name was anywhere on the deed. Mr. Blevins indicated that it was not on this deed.

Chairman Howard asked Jason Luallen if a board vote was required on this. Mr. Luallen stated that the board had previously executed action on this back in 1976 when it was originally dealt with and did not need another full vote. He further stated that if the board chose to record a vote that it would be fine.

Chairman Howard said he would feel better having the board vote on this. Mr. Blevins recommended the approval of the quit claim deed. A motion to approve was made by Mike Lowry, seconded by Sharon Brown. A voice vote was recorded. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

6. DIRECTOR OF SCHOOL'S REPORT

Mr. Blevins said he had several items for the board to add to their calendars.

Mr. Blevins stated he would be out of the office on September 11-14 to attend the annual TOSS meeting (TN Organization of School Superintendents). He said this was a state-wide meeting for all school superintendents.

Mr. Blevins said he has invited the State Commissioner of Education, Ms. Candace McQueen, to come and visit McMinn County Schools in support of our Read to Be Ready Initiative. He stated she would be in our school system on September 30. He said she would be coordinating her visit with two other districts in the area. Mr. Blevins said that at the September board meeting, he and Ms. Knight would discuss some of the Read to Be Ready activities that will be offered in our area. He said Commissioner McQueen has pushed out this initiative to emphasize reading in our communities.

Mr. Blevins said the start of our high school football season would begin with the biggest game of the season on Friday, August 19 with the Central High School Chargers hosting the McMinn County Cherokees.

Mr. Blevins reminded the board of the TSBA Fall District Meeting to be held on Thursday, September 1 at 5:00 p.m. in Marion County.

Mr. Blevins said on Friday, September 2 we would have a staff development opportunity for our teachers. He said this was our first attempt in providing a "PD" day earlier in the school year. Mr. Blevins stated this would give our families an earlier start to the long weekend and that we are in the process of organizing the event for our teachers and education support personnel.

7. PRAISES & COMPLIMENTS

Johnna Hampton praised the teachers and chaperones that went on the school trip to Puerto Rico. She commended them on the jobs they did and expressed her appreciation for their time and effort they put into giving the students an opportunity of a lifetime.

Henry Webb said while traveling to tonight's board meeting, he was reflecting on the past eight years. He said that he has represented the board for eight years which totaled to around 96 meetings and that he could count on one hand the number of meetings that he has missed during this time. Mr. Webb said he was thinking of how the Center has changed over the course of this time period. He further shared that we have gained a lot in technology in regards to how we are currently viewing our board packets. Mr. Webb said when he first became a board member, we were photocopying the board packet and distributing it by mail and that with the help of our great technology department, we are distributing it digitally today. He said it has been an education process for him and expressed his appreciation to the board for eight great years of service.
