On behalf of the Milltown Police Department I would like to wish all of our students a safe and successful 2017-2018 school year. Our department is committed to providing you and your family members with the best public safety practices available. This year you will see some changes in the Parkview School "Drop-Off Loop" procedure. The daily "Drop-Off Loop" will begin on Monday September 11th starting at 8:10 am. The school parking lot will remain closed daily until 8:10 am.

Parents who arrive earlier than 8:10 am **will not** be allowed to park/stand on Violet Terrace while waiting for the "Loop" to open. Parents who arrive earlier than 8:10 may **legally** park on JFK Drive while waiting for the "Loop" to open. When parking on JFK Drive we ask you to be courteous to area residents by not double parking, or blocking driveways.

Please remember that there is a "No Left Turn" from Gloria Bradford Park during school hours. If parents decide to wait in the Gloria Bradford Park you will not be allowed to make a left turn and enter the "Loop".

Parents who do not want to use the "Loop" are also encouraged to re-route their way to Gloria Bradford Park by way of Bruce Court. This will greatly help alleviate traffic congestion in the area of JFK Drive and Violet Terrace.

Parents who wish to park on Carina Drive or Debonis Drive, to use the "path", are also asked to be courteous to area residents by not parking by painted yellow curbs, double parking, or blocking driveways.

There were numerous documented traffic violations during the last school year and as a result we have implemented a "Strict Traffic Enforcement Area" program in the Parkview School area. New signs have been posted, and fresh lane markings have been painted to remind drivers to drive responsibly. We highly recommend that, if possible, you use the designated safe route to school by parking in the Gloria Bradford Park and allowing our trained crossing guard staff to safely cross your children to the school. The Milltown Police Department will continue to work with residents and school officials to keep our roads and routes to school as safe as possible.
