She has spent ten years in the Information Technology field working for Chief Dull Knife College, the Southern Ute Indian and Ute Mountain Ute Indian Tribes of Colorado. Lopez-Whiteskunk has traveled extensively throughout the country presenting and sharing the Ute culture through song, dance and presentations. In October of 2013, she was elected to serve as a member of the Ute Mountain Ute Tribal leadership. Lopez-Whiteskunk is a former Co-Chair for the Bears Ears Intertribal Coalition. She strongly believes that the inner core of healing comes from the knowledge of our land and elders.

Formerly, the Education Director for the Ute Indian Museum in Montrose, Colorado, she is honored to continue to protect, preserve and serve through education creating a better understanding of our resources and culture. A great foundation for a better tomorrow.
