AdvancEd Report

Ms. Arrington discussed the recently received AdvancEd Accreditation Engagement Review Report. Insights from the review including the following: "Human Resource leaders and staff have implemented a range of ongoing processes to ensure that the system attracts and retains a divers and talented teaching and support staff. In addition to a robust teacher induction program, the system's Diversity Recruitment Committee has adopted and monitors a plan to increase measures of diversity among professional staff". She thanked the committee for helping make this excellent report happen.

SC Teacher Virtual Career Fair
