Donations

SCHOOL COMMITTEE CHAIR REPORT

Introduction of new SEPAC President – Kaitlin Goldman

Mr. Chalmers introduced Ms. Kaitlin Goldman, President of SEPAC (Special Education Parent Advisory Counsel). SEPAC meetings are held on the second Wednesday of every month in the Freeman/Kennedy Media Center. All are invited to attend.

Update: Election at Freeman-Kennedy School

Mr. Dooley updated the audience on the recent election, noting that over 87% of the town voted. He thanked the many volunteers, including the Norfolk Board of Health and the Walpole Visiting Nurses who administered over 300 flu shots.

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SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

Strategic Approach to Superintendent Goal Setting

Dr. Allardi provided each Committee member with a guideline for the Superintendent Goal Setting from the Massachusetts Association of School Superintendents. A Subcommittee, consisting of Mr. Dooley, Mr. Chalmers and Mr. Doyle, has been formed to finalize the Superintendent's evaluation process.

Teacher Evaluation Feedback

Dr. Allardi reviewed the formal written feedback provided by the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education on Norfolk's Teacher Evaluation Agreement. There are five key components to the regulations, and in their review, Norfolk Public Schools are compliant with all five components.

Freeman-Kennedy MCAS Results Report, Spring 2012

Lisa Altham-Hickey, Principal and Trish Kelley, Data Specialist presented a power point presentation on the MCAS results of Spring 2012. Performance for all F/K students in grades 3-6 consistently remains above the state average.

Dr. Allardi will present to the committee, at the next meeting, aggregate data comparisons of the surrounding towns. To view the 10 districts that are comparable to Norfolk, information may be obtained at the Department of Education's website, District Analysis and Review Tools.
