ADMINISTRATIVE/REGULAR ITEMS

Donations

Norfolk Community League donated \$1,200.00 for Teacher Grants at the Freeman Kennedy School, and a \$500.00 donation to go towards the purchase of a SMART Board at the H. Olive Day School. The Norfolk TPA donated \$850.00 for Literacy Reading/Writing A-Z at the H. Olive Day. Target – Take Charge of Education donated \$1,446.80 to the H. Olive Day School.

MOTION: Mr. Flaherty made a motion to accept the donations from the Norfolk Community League, Norfolk TPA and Target. Mr. Doyle second. All in favor. **Motion Passed.**

SCHOOL COMMITTEE CHAIR REPORT

H. Olive Day Trust

The trust was established approximately 15 years ago. There is approximately \$68,000 dollars in the account. The attorneys are reviewing the account and investigating the possibility of dissolving the trust due to the excessive costs of maintaining and overseeing the account

H. Olive Day Playground

After meeting with the engineers and discussing site options, it was agreed to expand the playground at its current location. Each grade level submitted a “wish list” of what they would like to see added to the playground. Vendors will be submitting their proposals for the playground upgrades to the Committee. Once there is a final plan for the playground, the Committee will be pursuing other sources of funding, such as fundraising and grants.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

MCAS Comparison

Dr. Allardi provided the School Committee with an analysis of MCAS scores of districts that are comparable with Norfolk, showing how much the children have grown relative to other children across the state in the same range. Dr. Allardi also provided the Committee with a copy of the Criteria for Awarding Progress and Performance Index Outline. This information can be obtained on the Massachusetts Department of Education website, district accountability.

Go-Math Implementation Update

Kelly Whitmore, Assistant Principal at the Freeman-Kennedy School, gave a power point presentation showing the history, challenges, strengths and feedback from parents on the Go-Math Program.

NEST
