

(GED EXAM) HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY DIPLOMA

(GED EXAM) HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY DIPLOMA

The General Educational Development Examination (GED exam), often referred to as the high school equivalency exam, is administered each month by the Connecticut State Department of Education.

In order to apply for the GED examination, an individual should be 17 years of age or older and no longer enrolled in school. At the time of registration, individuals 17 and 18 years old must submit documentation from the last high school attended that they have either been officially withdrawn from school for at least six months (17 year-olds must have a withdrawal form with a parent or guardian signature) or the class with which they entered ninth grade (or would have entered if never enrolled in high school) has already graduated. In order to enroll in an adult education GED preparation program provided by a local school district, an individual must be at least 17 years old, officially withdrawn from school and must have a withdrawal form with a parent or guardian signature). There is no required waiting period to enroll in GED preparation courses.

The exam consists of five sub-tests:

Language Arts-Writing Skills consists of two parts.

1. Part One measures the ability to edit 50 questions in the objective part of the test using the editing skills of correction, revision and construction shift.

2. Part Two requires writing an essay on an assigned topic and measures the ability to compose a well-written response to a topic that is familiar to examinees.

3. Social Studies measures the ability to use higher order thinking skills in understanding fundamental social studies concepts.

4. Science measures higher order thinking skills included in fundamental and scientific understandings of life science, space science, and physical science.

5. Language Arts-Reading measures the examinee's ability to comprehend, apply and analyze literary selections.

6. Mathematics which will measure skills in number sense and operations data, statistics and probability geometry and measurement and algebra functions and patterns.

Successful completion of a GED practice test is recommended prior to registration. Registration must be in person at the Hamden Adult Education Office.

Experienced adults who want to earn a high school diploma may consider an alternate route. Working at their own rate, adults can demonstrate the skills and knowledge acquired through life experience. Upon completion of this program, North Haven residents will be awarded a North Haven Adult High School Diploma. Call the Hamden Adult Education office for more information at (203) 407-2028.

3 ADULT HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA CREDITS

North Haven residents can earn a North Haven Adult High School Diploma through the Hamden Adult Education Department.

Classes are offered in English, mathematics, social studies and science on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. Additional credits may be earned for work experience and/or independent work. **This program is most appropriate for individuals who were recently in high school but who lack a few credits.** Candidates who enjoy an academic setting and group interaction, or who plan to further their education and want to improve their academic skills, are also encouraged to enroll in this program. BOOKS AND MATERIALS

Students are required to purchase books or materials that are required for a particular course.

COURSE CONFIRMATION

Classes will be limited to optimum size for learning. Confirmation will not be sent, but you will be notified if your registration cannot be accepted. Registrations will be honored in the order received. If a course is oversubscribed, North Haven residents will be given priority. We reserve the right to limit enrollment or to withdraw scheduled courses from the program for lack of sufficient enrollment.

For reasons beyond our control, it is sometimes necessary to change staff, location, time and date. Any class longer than one night may take additional weeks to complete due to school closings. Please plan accordingly. See page 3 for those dates.

STORM DAY POLICY

If the regular school day session is cancelled or dismissed early, the evening session will not be held regardless of weather changes. FROM NEW HAVEN: 1-91 North - Exit 10 (CT- 40). Take first exit on CT-40. Turn right onto Devine Street. Take right onto State Street. Take right onto Dixwell Avenue. Take right onto CT-40 toward I-91/Bailey Road/Hartford/New Haven. Take the Bailey Road exit. At the first light turn right onto Elm Street. The high school is on the left at 221 Elm Street.

FROM HARTFORD: I-91 South - Exit 12 (Washington Avenue). Turn left onto Washington Avenue. Follow Washington Avenue through the center of North Haven (Town Green on left and Town Hall on right). Follow around the Green. Turn right onto Bailey Road. Turn left onto Elm Street at light. The high school is on the left at 221 Elm Street.

FROM PARKWAY - ROUTE 15:

FROM NEW YORK/NEW HAVEN: Route 15 - Exit 62 (Dixwell Avenue). Turn left onto Dixwell Avenue. After third traffic light turn left on CT-40 toward I-91/Bailey Road/Hartford/New Haven. Take the Bailey Road exit. At the first light turn right onto Elm Street. The high school is on the left at 221 Elm Street.

FROM HARTFORD: Route 15 - Exit 63 (Bishop Street). Turn left onto Hartford Turnpike. At the traffic light, turn left onto Bishop Street. Go straight through one traffic light. At the second light, turn right onto State Street. At second light turn right onto Dixwell Avenue. Take first right onto CT-40 toward I-91/Bailey Road/ Hartford/New Haven. Take the Bailey Road exit. At the first light turn right onto Elm Street. The high school is on the left at 221 Elm Street.
