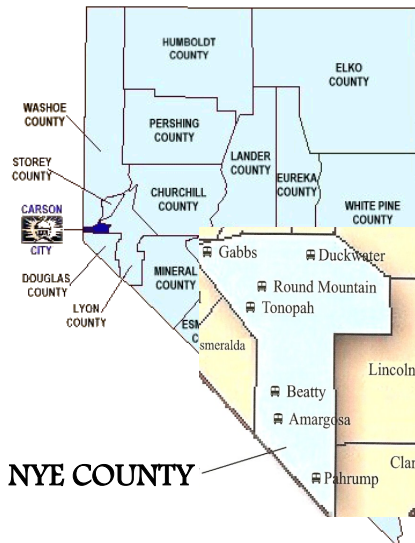

### Targeting Student Achievement

NCS D uses data to drive instructional decisions and focus teacher collaboration. Data is collected from:

- ◆ Common course assessments
- ◆ NWEA Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) Interim assessments
- ◆ State-mandated high stakes tests
- ◆ WIDA
- ◆ Parent surveys
- ◆ Student surveys



Parents receive regular reports of student progress and achievement which include:

- ◆ Parent-Teacher Conferences in October and March
- ◆ Progress reports every 3-5 weeks
- ◆ Quarterly report cards
- ◆ MAP reports (beginning of the year, middle of the year, end of year)
- ◆ High-stake Test results

Intervention and enrichment are available to students to maximize their potential.

### Curriculum & Instruction

- ◆ The Nevada Academic Content Standards are used to guide instruction within all district schools to prepare students for career, civic, and college readiness.
- ◆ Honors and AP courses in grades 6-12 are taught throughout Nye County School District including remote rural areas.
- ◆ Career and Technical Education (CTE) is offered in our high schools. Programs of study include Architectural Drafting & Design, Agriculture & Natural Resources, Automotive Technology, Business & Marketing Education, Culinary Arts, Family & Consumer Sciences, Foods & Nutrition, Furniture & Cabinet Making, Graphic Design, Photography, Video Production, and Welding Technology.
- ◆ A comprehensive, rigorous and relevant Pre-K - 12 math curriculum which will prepare students for the technological future has been adopted by Nye County School District.
- ◆ Teachers and administrators are held to the high standards of the Nevada Educator Performance Framework to give ALL students the opportunity and support they need to be successful.
- ◆ To ensure excellent instruction for every student in every class every day the district supports collaborative professional learning communities to develop and retain high quality teachers and administrators.
