## **Mission Statement**

JG Johnson Elementary School will provide a safe, nurturing environment where positive learning experiences result in academic success for all!

## **Principal's Highlights**

The staff is focusing on school-wide programs to develop the knowledge, skills, and mindset needed for our students to excel to and through college and become leaders in our community.

- Attendance rate increased by 1.3% from the 2013-14 school year.
- Decreased the number of 3rd graders emergent on the CRT Reading test by 4.1%, and 5th graders by 1.7%.
- Increased the number of 5th graders that meet reading standards by 3.4% and proficient by 1.3%.
- Decreased the number of 3rd graders emergent on the CRT math test by 7.9% and 5th graders by 11.5%.
- Increased the number of 3rd graders that exceeded standards by 3.1% and 5th graders that meet standards by 2.4% and proficient by 2.6%.
- Created an after school tutoring and enrichment program.
- The staff designed and implemented small-group differentiated-instruction during specific blocks of time throughout the week.
- An Intervention Specialist assists teachers in helping struggling readers, analyzing data, collaborating with teachers, and creating ways to motivate students.
- Family night designed to help parents become invested in the college-prep mission.

## **Goals and Objectives**

### Goal 1

Increase the percentage of students proficient in reading.

### Objective(s):

Reduce number of Low students by 5% in grades 1 thru 5, increase Average and High Average to over 50%. Increase High students by 7% in grades 1 thru 5, as measured by the 2014-15 NWEA Reading. Reduce Emergent students by 5%, increase Meets by over 50% and increase Exceeds by 7.2% on the SBAC Test.

#### Goal 2

Increase the percentage of students proficient in writing.

### Objective(s):

Increase the percent of proficient students in grades 3-5 by 15% as measured by the Nevada Formative Writing Tools.

### Goal 3

Increase the percentage of students proficient in Math.

## Objective(s):

Reduce the number of Low students by 4% in grades 1 thru 5. Increase Average and High Average to over 54%. Increase number of\_High by 5% in grades 1 thru 5, as measured by the 2014-15 NWEA Math. Reduce Emergent students by 4%, increase Meets to over 54%, and increase Exceeds by 5% on the SBAC test.

## **School Communication Efforts**

JG Johnson offers communication to parents, family, and the community through the use of monthly newsletters, Everyday Math

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Homelinks, progress reports every three weeks, and quarterly report cards. A computer Kiosk is available at the school for parents to access student grades and attendance from the District PowerSchool Student Information System. Blackboard connect automated messaging system is used to inform parents of important school dates/events/activities. The staff and administration maintain interactive communication with the Parent Advisory Committee. JG Johnson involves parents in after-school events, monthly academic celebrations, music and concerts, Family Literacy Nights, parent-teacher conferences and open house.
