- 4. Director Sexton announced the Star Fish Awards winners. The award honors those who make a difference in the lives of others in the school system. Star Fish winners for April are Brenda Smith, Kim Maxey and Jodie Green.
- 5. Mrs. Melinda McCartt, School Health Coordinator, gave a report. Mrs. McCartt attended the School Nutrition Conference March 20 22. Changes discussed during the conference included, an increase in grains, twice the number of fruits and vegetables, elimination of salt, portioning/weighing food and the increase in lunch costs. School Breakfast Week went very well with approximately 65 participants at OMS and approximately 100 at OES. Staff immunizations were completed this week. Thanks to Mountain Peoples for administering the immunizations. Also,

Mountain Peoples will be assisting with free physicals for Oneida athletes beginning April 17. The Coordinated School Health Institute will be April 16-19. On April 25, the School Health Advisory Council will meet from 12-2 discussing the school health index, what has been working in school health, and what needs improvement. On May 16, the CSH office will be partnering with other local parties for a Teen Parenting Seminary from 9-2. Haley Shepard and Rhonda Laxton have started a Physical Activity and Nutrition Class after school on Mondays and Wednesdays with approximately 18-20 participants. "Kick Butts Day" was March 20.

Chairperson Williamson recognized Mr. Kevin Byrd, Oneida Middle and High School Principal.

- The schools are working preparing for TCAP testing which will be the week of April 22. Please make sure your child is in attendance, gets to school on time and eats a good breakfast.
