April 13, 2017

The Oneida Special School District Board of Education met in regular session on Thursday, April 13, 2017, at 6:00 p.m. in the Oneida High School Library. The following members were present: Dr. Danny Cross, Mrs. Dorothy Watson, Mr. Brom Shoemaker, Mr. Mark Matthews and Dr. Nancy Williamson. Also in attendance were Director Jeanny Hatfield, Student Representative Chloe Matthews and Lori Marcum, Secretary.

Chairperson Williamson called the meeting to order. Griffin Lafferty led those in attendance in the pledge of allegiance.

Chairperson Williamson acknowledged Dr. Hatfield for a presentation recognizing Teachers of the Year and Staff Members of the Year. The Oneida Elementary Teacher of the Year is Mrs. Amanda Terry. 1. Mrs. May discussed the Read to Be Ready program. The Read to Be Ready program is to instill a love of reading for students who have had little reading success. Last year, the program served 20 up-coming K-3 students and their families. Four certified teachers (Mrs. Wilson, Mrs. Cooper, Ms. Armstrong and Mrs. Rector) served in the program, making the student/teacher ratio 5 to 1. Each student was given 54 books for their home libraries. Twenty-three family members participated in the camp events that included field trips and literacy meetings. Students spent an estimated 1920 minutes reading and an estimated 1440 minutes writing during camp. When the students returned to school in the fall, 16 out of 20 improved their NWEA percentile score, showing no summer loss, but summer growth. Of those 20 students, 8 of the 20 were now above grade level in reading.
