## August 4, 2016

The Oneida Special School District Board of Education met in regular session on Thursday, August 4, 2016, at 6:00 p.m. in the Central Office Conference Room. The following members were present: Dr. Danny Cross, Mrs. Dorothy Watson, Mr. Brom Shoemaker, Mr. Mark Matthews and Dr. Nancy Williamson. Also in attendance were Director Jeanny Hatfield, Student Representative Chloe Matthews and Lori Marcum, Secretary.

Chairperson Williamson called the meeting to order. Cade Sexton led those in attendance in the pledge of allegiance.

James Stewart with the Elgin Children's Foundation made a presentation on Bible Release Time. The foundation in cooperation with Children's Bible Ministry and ALQI is requesting 1 hour per month to minister to students from OES grades 3-5. Transportation would be provided for those who want to attend and participation requires parental approval. Students will be transported to Bethlehem Baptist Church. After a brief discussion, the board stated they would discuss further and get an answer to the foundation soon.

- School Health Screenings will be September 16<sup>th</sup> for Oneida Elementary and September 9<sup>th</sup> for OHS/OMS.
- CSH of Oneida has partnered with Asthma and Allergy Center of Knoxville to administer free PFT / asthma Screens for all students in grades 4 and 7.
- Ridgeview Mental Health, partnered with OSSD School Health to educate staff using QPR for suicide intervention and awareness training. A Team of 27 staff members were also trained in Youth Mental Health First Aid through TDOE Special Projects.
- Vanderbilt University is Scheduled to train wellness staff and administration on August 25,26. This training will be for the Life Skills Curriculum, Blueprints for Learning.
- TDOE trained staff on August 4, 2016, about the importance of School Climate and Safety Procedures for the 2016-17 school year.
- CSH partnered with ALQI, STAND, and Scott County Schools to host the Back to School Supply event on July 30, 2016. Over 1950 people were reached during this event.
- CPR AED classes held on July 21<sup>st</sup>, 2016 trained 47 staff members. THANK YOU Children's Hospital!
- The Scott County and Regional Health Department funded the "Wilderness in the Smokies" FACT SUMMIT for Oneida Schools first T4 Team. The Summit addressed tobacco and substance abuse while training youth to be leaders and advocates within their schools. Thank you Mr. Brown for being a chaperone!
