

#### February 1, 2018

The Oneida Special School District Board of Education met in regular session on Thursday, February 1, 2018, at 6:00 p.m. in the Central Office Conference Room. Chairperson Williamson called the meeting to order. Aubrey and Sadie Gunter led those in attendance in the pledge of allegiance.

## **Coordinated School Health Initiatives**

- Coordinated School Health Professional Development, was held January 12 and covered topics on opioid drug use and School Health Action Plans.
- School Health, CHAMPS and Scott Health Department are collaborating to bring drug, opioid, tobacco, hygiene and technology etiquette education to Oneida Middle School Students this spring.
- Dr. Joan Van Bryant visited Oneida Middle School and Oneida Coordinated School Health on January 26<sup>th</sup> to review the progress of the BluePrints for Learning Life Skills program. Dr. VanBryant was impressed with Ms. Jeffers implementation of the program. Mrs. McCartt will attend the s BluePrints spring Conference in Colorado. *Blueprints for Learning* is a Life skills curriculum that teaches social, emotional, drug addiction resistance education to middle school students. The program was made possible by a grant written by Coordinated School Health of Oneida.
- CDC and the National Youth Tobacco Survey have chosen Oneida High School to participate in their survey to obtain information about tobacco and drug use. The survey is scheduled for March 7<sup>th</sup>.
- Oneida Elementary and Oneida Coordinated School Health were recognized in the local paper this month for their action based learning initiatives: *Read to Ride and Imagination Playground*.
- Oneida CSH is in the final stages of Project Diabetes Walking Trail Initiative.
   Oneida CSH will present details of the project to The Tennessee Department of Health on May 9<sup>th</sup>. The final "kick off" for the project is May 18<sup>th</sup>.
- Oneida Coordinated School Health was invited to participate in *Project Hope* during the January 18, 2018 meeting. Project of Hope is sponsored by BCBS of Tennessee and is part of the Upper Cumberland Health Equity panel. Oneida CSH will participate on this Advisory Panel on January 31<sup>st</sup>. The purpose of the panel is to drive health equity between Tennessee communities.
- Healthy School Teams will meet February 23<sup>rd</sup> at 12:00 p.m. at central office. Topics of discussion: School Health Index, Project Diabetes, drug education.

- Breakfast has been proven to improve: Attention, Attendance, Behavior and Achievement.
- Breakfast lowers BMI by at least 17%.
- Students who eat breakfast score 17.5% higher on academic testing
- More than 1/2 of our students are eligible for free or reduced breakfast.
