## Oneida Special School District State & District Testing Information

**NWEA** – Is a Universal Screener used to benchmark student progress throughout the school year. This test is given to students in grades K-8, three times per year and is used to place students in intervention groups, and to monitor progress. NWEA is used at the high school level for students that are placed in intervention groups as a placement screener and as a progress monitoring tool. Parents will be informed by their child's teacher regarding their child's progress and assessment scores.

**TN Ready –** Is an achievement test mandated by the State of Tennessee for grades 3-8 and is administered at the end of the school year. The purpose of this assessment is to measure student achievement. Results will be given to students and parents when they are made available by the State – most likely the semester following testing.

**End of Course –** Assessments are given in certain subject areas for grades 9-12 at the end of each semester. The purpose of these assessments is to measure student achievement. Results will be given to students and parents when they are made available by the State – most likely the semester following testing.
