Executive Message

It is an exciting time to be at Blue Creek Elementary right now. We will celebrate our 60th anniversary next school year and have begun preparations for some exciting educational celebrations. The staff has worked diligently to raise the expectations of our students thus creating an atmosphere of success and achievement. We are so very proud of the work that has been done and continues to be done to the aesthetics of the facility and to the quality of instruction that is being provided to our students.

As we move forward with our School of Scientific Inquiry theme, we have been experiencing a variety of other successes that are worth mentioning to our stakeholders. Blue Creek was granted the first chapter of a National Elementary Honor Society in Onslow County. To engage our students with active learning strategies and organizational skills that will prepare them for success, we have instituted AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) in our fourth and fifth grade and have begun the transition to lower grades. We have also begun the process of training teachers at the K-3 level in elementary AVID and have added an AVID period to our WAVE schedule which continues to be our method of choice for program implementation. This could open the door to Blue Creek becoming a National Elementary Demonstration Site for AVID.

Our theme of Scientific Inquiry is permeated throughout our culture and in our regularly scheduled K-5 STEM lab which helps reinforce classroom instruction in the areas of science, technology and mathematics. Blue Creek continues to host the Onslow County Elementary Science fair and sponsors a Community Science Day to showcase local scientific careers and opportunities that are available to students. Through grant writing and as a part of the 2016 North Carolina Science Festival, we were awarded the Duke Energy Science Kits. We will also be participating in the Duke Energy Progress "Space Station Conservation" program. During the 2013-2014 year, Blue Creek was recognized as a Green Ribbon School for our PBIS program and was recognized as a Model School during the 2014-2015 school year. Blue Creek also continues to be a leader in data dissemination to students and staff. We have created a "HOP" (Hour of Power) period three days a week to work with individual students whose data shows they are not meeting growth. With eyes on the future, we look forward to the exciting work ahead of us to further improve instruction at Blue Creek.

This strategic plan will provide Blue Creek Elementary School with focused goals, objectives and strategies that are needed to continue are vision of Excellence in Education. This plan will also guide our mission to enhance student achievement and foster leadership through instructional methods of inquiry. We look forward to the continued progress of our school and students.



School Profile

Blue Creek Elementary is a suburban and rural elementary school on Highway 53 just outside the city limits of Jacksonville, North Carolina. The school was built in 1956 and has been serving students for 59 years. The school will celebrate 60 years of serving children in the Southwest district in August of 2016. We receive students who reside in a school district of less than ten miles. We are one of three elementary schools in the Southwest district of Onslow County. A contributing factor in the Blue Creek Elementary community is the Camp Lejeune Marine Corps base and the New River Marine Corps Air Station. Approximately 25% of the student body (122 students) were federally connected during the 2014-2015 school year.

Blue Creek Elementary is one of thirty-seven public schools in Onslow County and is one of twenty elementary schools. The school's enrollment has remained stable in recent years with an average daily membership of 470 students. Due to the socio-economic levels of the population, Blue Creek Elementary qualifies as a Title I school. The percentage of students receiving free or reduced lunch has increased this year to approximately 65% of the student body.

Blue Creek Elementary is served by nine regular school buses, two Exceptional Children buses, one daycare bus and two daycare vans.

Faculty and Staff

Blue Creek Elementary has 69 employees that serve children. The school has two administrators; one counselor; one nurse; one school social worker; three office support employees; one media specialist; one Military Family Life Counselor; one part-time AIG specialist, one literacy coach and IT technician, one part-time Instructional Coach, a part-time ESL facilitator; one Title I reading specialist, two part-time Title One tutors and one speech pathologist. We have one cross-categorical Exceptional Children teacher and three self-contained classrooms: Two classrooms utilizing the adaptive curriculum and one using the standard curriculum. We have 22 regular education homerooms: 4 kindergartens, 4 first grades, 4 second grades, 4 third grades, 3 fourth grades and 3 fifth grades. We currently have 5 teacher assistants in regular classrooms and 3 Exceptional Children teacher assistants. Of the present certified staff members, 46% have advanced degrees and two are Nationally Board Certified. Of the entire staff, 17% are African American and 83% are white.

Student Performance Data

Blue Creek elementary met AYP for the 2013-2014 school year. The school met 21 out of 21 Measurable Annual Objectives last year. Blue Creek Students met Growth Status in accordance with the Ready Accountability Model.

Final testing results for the 2014-2015 school year indicated we met 17 of the 27 Annual Measurable Objectives (63%), with a performance composite of 43.1 for CCR and 52.8 GLP. Our growth status was “not met” with a growth index of -2.54. Reading in grades 3-5 met 7 out of their 10 Annual Measurable Objectives. Students in grades 3-5 Math, met 5 out of their 10 Annual Measurable Objectives. Our 5th grade science students met 4 out of their 6 Annual Measurable Objectives.

Articulation and Transition

As part of the Southwest Community, Blue Creek believes in the power of communication and articulation among stakeholders. Blue Creek has received two PBIS recognitions (Green Ribbon in 2013-2014 and awarded Model School status in 2014-2015).

Pre K- Kindergarten

Blue Creek Elementary hosts annual school visits from area preschools and day cares. We invite parents to come visit the school before its opening. We provide important parent information packets at the time of registration. We hold the “ABC”s of Kindergarten evening for parents of upcoming students. Staggered enrollment also allows a gentle introduction and transition for students into the public school setting.

2nd-3rd

Blue Creek has focused its attention on the articulation of instructional program to ease transition issues in grades 2 and 3. We will begin an “Hour of Power” schedule three days a week to assist teachers in differentiating instruction. We utilize a school-wide math program called Eureka (engageny.org) to ensure continuity in the delivery of math instruction. Blue Creek benchmark and common formative assessments will be delivered to provide a familiar platform for students. WAVE scheduling, science lab rotations and a comprehensive character education all contribute to smooth alignment and articulation at Blue Creek.



School Profile

5th-6th

AVID has been a powerful avenue for transition of our 5th grades students to middle school. We sponsor visiting 6th grade AVID students to come talk to our 5th graders about middle school life and how AVID is implemented at that level. We have also developed an AVID partnership with SWMS students/staff to assist us in furthering our AVID knowledge and to begin the introductions to AVID tutorials in 5th grade. Our students visit their perspective middle schools in the spring of each year. Both SWMS and BCE utilize PBIS with fidelity and have obtained state recognition in this area. The consistency with these two programs assists students with understanding the behavioral expectations as they transition to middle school.
