The Onslow County Learning Center has experienced tremendous growth during the 2013/2014 school year. With the support of district leaders and supportive staff members we have been able to address severe individual student challenges that would have resulted in an even higher dropout rate than what was experienced this past year. We are incorporating additional training and collaboration to identify targeted instructional practices to enhance student achievement. We constantly seek out ways to ensure that students are exposed to equable academic opportunities to ensure that students do not suffer academically while in attendance at OCLC. Our 70% male population was routinely supported throughout the year through a community male based mentoring group: The Magnanimous Mentoring.

**School's Strengths:**

- Teachers hold multiple certifications
- Campus Wide Project Based Learning
- Heightened staff moral and a sense of family with joint purpose and goals
- High Community Involvement
- Classroom Without Walls fosters student leadership, hands on learning and increased social skills

**School's Challenges:**

- High truancy rate
- Increased number of students that have severe mental diagnoses and felony related charges with the judicial system
- Over 30% of student population is identified as EC

- Addressing the high number of discipline referral in a fashion that does not contribute to student absences

**2014-2015 Focused Next Actions:**

Utilize USATest Prep on a weekly basis to increase administrative and teacher analysis of student data to drive instruction

All teachers will apply for local, state or federal grants to enhance their daily instructions.

Entire campus will utilize the 1:1 initiative by each student having daily access to a Chromebook to adhere to district mandates: Discovery Education, Edmodo, and SharpSchools.

Continue our Project Based Learning Initiative

Increase parental awareness through daily behavior sheets, monthly newsletters, parent call logs, and current web pages
