## GOAL #1 Students will be globally competitive through a rigorous and relevant curriculum

- Purchased Elmos so all but 4 classrooms now have them
- Differentiated Instruction-teams plan on Tuesdays to target At Risk students
- Incorporate reading buddies
- Implemented strategies from the Bridges
- Develop an enrichment period to target special groups
- Develop an in house mentoring program for At Risk Students Continue Freshman Partnership
- PLC led by Teacher Academy attendees on new Teacher Standards and Reflective teaching CONTINUING
- Participate in math Bridges program PARKWOOD HAS 5 TEACHERS TAKING PART
- Train the Trainer for staff in interventions for at risk students has been done
- Established a Science Lab for grades 3-5 which teachers schedule for use

## GOAL #2 Staff and students will be led by creative, passionate and proficient technologically skilled professionals

- All teachers have speakers, lab top and Elmos. All but 4 classrooms have Mimios
- Computer resource room was established with 16 computers for scheduled use
- PLC were focused on improving teacher strategies and reflective practices
- Teacher and Assistant of the Week recognition was implemented
- Community bulletin Board had regular updated information on staff and student successes

## GOAL #3 Onslow County students will learn in a safe environment to be civil, healthy and productive citizens

- Each grade provided and implemented a plan for structured recess
- Three additional cameras have been added to the campus to enhance security
- CHAMPS guidelines were used to enhance strategies for safety
- Community Prevention Services provided a monthly program to 5<sup>th</sup> graders
- Strike Two presented a drug resistance program to the 4<sup>th</sup> grade
- Job Fair was held representing many roles of leaders in our community and safety programs

## GOAL #4 Leadership will foster innovation in the Onslow County School System with the cooperation of families and community partners

- A literacy night was incorporated with our quarterly PTO focusing on one grade level each meeting
- Each PLC developed and implemented a transition plan with the grade above and the grade below
- Teachers continued to update and enhance their school websites
- Daily entries were done in a reflective journal which were discussed at the monthly PLC meeting
- Volunteers were trained and a Sanity Savers program was implemented to assist teachers

## GOAL #5 Onslow County Schools will be an effective and efficient system

- PLC's were formed with a focus on being a reflective teacher. They were teacher led. Each group met monthly and shared focused topics and journal entries from their daily journals
- Scheduling was incorporated through calendars set up in the Public folders for using the computer lab, media center, Science Lab, school events and reserving the multipurpose room
- Attendance was done through the new online NCWISE by teachers each day
- Grade chairs meet once a month with Administration and information was disseminated and then passed on through grade meetings.
- Staff meetings were focused on the New Teacher Evaluation Process and analyzing student data
- PEP and IIT process was streamlined and presented to staff for consistency

Overall Parkwood's 2005-2010 School Strategic Plan was a success. IF one looks at the school environment, community relationships, student achievement and safety the data from the Parent , Student and Staff Climate Surveys, Teacher Working Conditions Survey, EOG test scores and Triple S Safety evaluation over the past five years, continued improvement is ongoing. There has been a growth in the overall rating by parents, staff and students on the safety, educational environment, administration involvement, parent communications and student academia.

As we continue to move forward with our 2010-2012 Strategic Plan we are focused on data analysis, continuous improvement, relentless safety and the well being of our students as we continue to prepare them to be globally competitive students and leaders in our community.
