Where Excellence in Education Begins

Richlands Primary will prepare all students to achieve grade level proficiency and produce responsible citizens who are globally competitive learners in the 21st century.

RPS- Rigorously Prepares Students

Goal 1:

- Kindergarten Reading had a 17% increase in proficiency (76% to 89%)
- First Grade Reading had a 34.3% increase in proficiency (60% to 80.6%)
- Second Grade Reading had a 30.64% increase in proficiency (62% to 81%)
- Overall Reading Proficiency increased 27.27% (66% to 84%)
- Our Splash Program was increased from Kindergarten to First Grade
- A monthly international teaching day was implemented as well as an International Fun Day and Parade

Goal 2:

- 50% of the First Grade Team attended the AVID Summer Institute
- 4 staff members attended all Digital Army trainings
- 8 staff members presented professional development
- Differentiated professional development options were given to staff through a shared ERPD plan between RPS, RES and STES
- Staff participated in technology training offered by the DLTS

Goal 3:

- 52% of bus referrals avoided student suspension
- 100% of students received training on Digital Citizenship through Computer Assistant
- 100% of staff members approved our school theme – Community Leadership
- Students participated in monthly classroom guidance lessons
- “Fun Run” Club was established for students

Goal 4:

- 332 parents completed the ASSIST Parent Survey (114% increase – National High Percentages for Parent Response Rate)
- 100% parents approved our school theme – Community Leadership
- 223 families attended our evening Family Reading Night
- 2 parent involvement videos were filmed
- An evening parent visioning/forum meeting was held

Goal 5:

- 157 Samsung Galaxy 7” tablets were ordered – giving each classroom a set of 5
- 2 SMART Boards were purchased
- School Messenger usage was increased 200%
- Faculty Focus was sent weekly
- Implemented Car Rider Tags for student security during student release

Overall Successes

One of RPS' greatest accomplishments for the 2014-2015 school year was a 27% increase in reading proficiency. We attribute this increase to a focus on reading data analysis and differentiated instruction aligned to the Daily 5 Literacy Framework. In addition, parental participation has increased significantly as evidenced by a 114% increase in stakeholder feedback.

- Utilize grade level PLC's to investigate declines in student proficiency in math and writing and design instructional strategies to increase student performance
- Implement enVisions Math 2016
- Implement WAVE Schedule
- Implement community portion of school theme Community Leadership
- Participate in book study for the Leader in Me as an instructional guide for student leadership
- Send Kindergarten team to AVID Summer Institute
- Increase the number of staff-led trainings
