- High transient student population
- Increasing ELL population at the school
- Meeting the needs of a large student population (800 + students) with limited resources and personnel

- Utilize the outdoors to teach the curriculum and incorporating the environmental theme of the school, students will be more active participants in their learning
- Continue to provide additional opportunities for students to achieve grade level proficiency while participating in the extended day program
- Write and apply for additional funding (grants) that will support the school's theme of environmental education
- Immerse students in cultural studies and programs developed by the three international teachers employed at the school

- The school exceeded expected growth as measured on the EOG's in the spring of 2014
