- * You live within the boundaries of a Shiawassee County school district or a contiguous district.
- * Your child has not been suspended or expelled from school within the last 24 months.
- * You are aware that transportation to our district is the sole responsibility of the parent.
- * You are aware that in the event a student requires special education services from the Shiawassee Regional Education Service District, and a cooperative agreement cannot be reached, the student may be required to return to their resident district.
