

Our Services

Forensic Interviewing-Special trained forensic interviewers allow the child to tell their story in a child friendly environment. Hopefully the child will only have to tell their story once.

Extended Forensic Interviewing-Special trained extended forensic interviewers (forensic evaluators) build rapport with the child and allow the child to tell their story over time in a child friendly environment.

Counseling services-Trained counselors provide therapy to children who have been through a forensic interview/extended forensic interview in a child friendly environment.

Kids Kourt-Children who will testify in court receive preparation for what to expect.

Family Advocate-The CAC family advocate meets with non-offending parents during the forensic interview and follows up with them throughout the court process.



Family Resources-Families of abuse victims and those involved with the parenting groups are provided with numerous community resources that are available to them.

Parent Education Classes-This group is designed for those parents who need help with basic parenting skills and/or mandated by the courts or the Department of Human Resources to attend parenting classes. Topics covered include discipline techniques, anger management, stress relief, positive parenting, age appropriate behavior, etc.

Parent Support Classes-This group is for any parent who has experienced a personal crisis involving their child, a family member, or a close friend. Topics covered include peer support, stress relief, anger management, coping skills, etc.

Mentoring Program-Children/adolescents whose parents are involved in the family enrichment/parenting classes are paired one on one with a Troy University volunteer. This program works with children and adolescents on behavior modification, violence prevention, and social skills.

School Based Prevention Programs

Good Touch/Bad Touch-Body safety rules, stranger danger, internet safety and cell phone safety are taught at age appropriate levels to 2nd, 5th, and 7th grades in the schools with parent permission. Groups can also be taught for daycares and kindergarten age children.

Child Abuse Prevention Programs (CAPP)-These groups are for children who are deemed to be "at risk" and are referred by school counselors, teachers, or administrators. Topics discussed include self-esteem, families, social skills, violence prevention, abuse, drugs and alcohol, etc.

Teen Parent Support Groups-These groups are for teen parents who are in the school system. Topics discussed include anger management, child abuse, age appropriate development and behavior, positive parenting, etc.

Community Awareness-CAC staff members are willing to speak to groups and organizations about the services the PRCA/FRC provides to Pike, Coffee, Barbour, and Bullock counties.
