

Quitman Junior High School

GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

Quitman Junior High School agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

The **Quitman Junior High School** will hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs. The school will convene the meeting at a time convenient for parents and will offer a flexible number of additional parental involvement meetings, such as in the morning or evening, so that as many parents as possible are able to attend. The school will invite all parents of children participating in Title I, Part A programs to this meeting, and will encourage them to attend, by:

- Postings on website, Facebook, newsletters
 - Providing interpreter/translator for Spanish speaking families
4. The **Quitman Junior High School** will provide parents of participating children information in a timely manner about Title I, Part A programs that includes a description and explanation of the school's curriculum, the forms of academic assessment used to measure children's progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet by:
- Hosting parent night/open house
 - Posting relevant information on school websites
5. The **Quitman Junior High School** will at the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible by:
- Response to surveys
 - Campus meetings
 - Conduct parent and family engagement annual meeting
6. The **Quitman Junior High School** will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts and reading by:
- Mailing reports home when available from the state
7. The **Quitman Junior High School** will take the following actions to provide each parent timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified within the meaning of the term in section 200.56 of the Title I Final Regulations (67 Fed. Reg. 71710, December 2, 2002) by:
- Mailing letters to parents
8. The **Quitman Junior High School** will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph --
- the state's academic content standards,
 - the state's student academic achievement standards,
 - the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
 - the requirements of Part A,
 - how to monitor their child's progress, and
 - how to work with educators:
 - Obtain feedback from surveys
 - Data evaluation regarding effectiveness of programs offered already
9. The **Quitman Junior High School** will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:
- Hosting family nights
 - Parent-teacher conferences

10. The **Quitman Junior High School** will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:
 - Hosting parent/family nights, open house, and meet the teacher
 - Communicating through website, Facebook, and newsletters
 - Parent-Teacher conferences

11. The **Quitman Junior High School** will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and activities with Head Start, Reading First, Early Reading First, Even Start, Home Instruction Programs for Preschool Youngsters, the Parents as Teachers Program, public preschool, and other programs. The school will also conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children, by:
 - Using all above avenues of communication
 - Provide translated materials or interpreter, when requested

12. The **Quitman Junior High School** will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent-programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:
 - Translated materials, when requested
 - Posting on all school websites and other applicable areas
