

Pendleton County Training Weekend

The Pendleton County Training Weekend will be held Friday, August 9, Saturday, August 10, and Sunday, August 11, 2013.

Basic Auto Extrication

Basic EKG Review / 12 & 15 Lead

Prerequisite – EMT or higher certification

Description of class: This class is a fast paced review of basic EKG interpretation. Topics include a review of basic rhythms, blocks, and treatment for hemodynamic unstable patients in each instance. This class is designed for you to quickly identify ST elevated myocardial infarctions. We will also be looking for R ventricular and posterior STEMI's. While this class is short in time, it is packed with great information and retainable knowledge.

Death in the Field Scene Management

4 Hours, Friday evening 6 - 10

Prerequisites: None

Open to Junior Firefighters - Yes

Description of class: This class will discuss how to preserve and manage a death scene not taught in any EMS curriculum. Responding to a call for a DOA is an everyday occurrence for police, fire, and EMS. Every scene is different and stress is usually a factor. Learn what to expect, your role, and the role of law enforcement and the Medical Examiner's Office. This is a lecture and hands-on scene management course that you will definitely use in the field.

End Tidal CO₂ & CPAP

4 hrs, Saturday 1 - 5

Prerequisites – EMT or higher certification

Open to Junior Firefighters - No

Description of class: This class will show you that ETCO₂ monitoring is not just for anesthesia anymore. ETCO₂ monitoring will provide you valuable information about respiration, ventilation and perfusion. Capnography also provide proof in court that a patient was intubated. This class will change your way of thinking about aggressive airway management. Most pt.'s who arrive in the ER intubated have bought a 3 day stay in the hospital. Most pt.'s who arrive on CPAP are discharged from the ER. Reduces the Pt.'s risk of infection and approved for BLS providers. We will discuss what Pt. need it and what Pt.'s we can't use it on.

Fire Investigation, Level 2

Prerequisites – Fire Investigation, Level 1 (Arson Investigation 1 and 2 classes will also satisfy the prerequisite requirement)

Description of class: There will be a review of fire behavior, fire patterns, evidence recognition, preservation and collection, fire scene processing, fire scene documentation and report preparation. Participants will be required to conduct and document a fire scene investigation and prepare a written report for court testimony. Participants are required to provide proper attire and safety equipment for processing a fire scene. Bring any forms used by your department that will assist with scene documentation. Participants are encouraged to bring their digital camera and laptop.

HazMat Awareness

4 hours, Friday Evening 6 - 10

Prerequisites - None

Description of class for school brochure – This course provides training at the awareness level to familiarize first responders with how to recognize hazardous materials and what initial actions can be taken to ensure the safety of the responders and the community. The class meets Hazardous Materials Awareness NFPA 472, 2008 Ed. Requirements. Topics include the proper use of the Department of Transportation Emergency Response Guidebook, Identifying the primary hazards associated with each hazard class and division, and identifying the role of the awareness level personnel during hazardous materials/WMD incidents. This class meets the WV EMS Continuing Education requirement for Hazardous Materials.
