## GUIDELINES HAROLD AND JULIA KENNEY COLLEGIATE MONETARY GRANT

Trustees of the Village Board, Hennepin, Illinois have elected to provide collegiate monetary grants to residents of the Village of Hennepin. The grants will consist of an award of \$450 for the student's first full term of study after graduation from high school. The grants will be subsidized through funds provided by Harold and Julia Kenney. The grants are intended to encourage study beyond high school and to help defray tuition, room and board, fees, and other necessary expenses normally experienced by college students. The grants may be awarded in addition to any other financial aid the student may receive.

1. Applicants must have been a resident of the Village of Hennepin for a full year immediately prior to the date of high school graduation, and the parent/s or legal guardian/s who have legal custody of the applicant must also have been a resident of the Village of Hennepin for a full year immediately prior to the date of the applicant's high school graduation.

2. Payment of grant awards will be made at the beginning of the first full term of study beyond high school after the student has presented evidence to the secretary of the Scholarship and Grant Committee that he/she has enrolled for at least 12 semester hours or 12 quarter hours. If a student fails to attend school for at least nine weeks, he/she will be obligated to refund one half the amount awarded at the beginning of the semester or quarter.

3. Application may be made any time after January 1 of the student's senior year but no later than 90 school days after the student begins his/her first semester of full-time study beyond high school. Application must be made within 40 months of high school graduation.

4. The grants may be used at any school or institution on the approved list of schools as published by the Illinois State Scholarship Commission or an equivalent out of state school as listed by the Guaranteed Student Loan Program.

5. These grants may be used in addition to any other scholarships, grants, loans, or other types of financial aid the student may receive.

6. Recipients of the GED Diploma may apply for a grant provided they meet all other guidelines.

7. Application for the grants should be made with the secretary of the Hennepin Village Grant and Scholarship Committee (Chris Dvorak), who will make a recommendation to the Hennepin Village Board suggesting the recipients of the grants based on these guidelines.

8. The Hennepin Village Grant and Scholarship Committee will make judgments on cases not covered in the above guidelines.
