



The Governor's School of North Carolina is a five and one-half week summer residential program for intellectually gifted high school students, integrating academic disciplines, the arts, and unique courses on each of two campuses. It is the oldest statewide summer residential program for academically or intellectually gifted high school students in the nation.

The program, which is open to rising seniors only, with exceptions made for rising juniors in selected performing/visual arts areas, is located on two campuses: Governor's School West at Salem College in Winston-Salem (began in 1963), and Governor's School East at Meredith College in Raleigh (began in 1978).
