Rappahannock County High School Foundations of Agriculture Syllabus 2013-2014

Textbook Used: Agriscience Fundamentals and Applications, Fifth Edition

Course Description

Students explore science as it relates to agriculture and develop an understanding of human relations, communication, the importance of agriculture to the economy, and key scientific terms related to the field of agriculture through the study of animal science, plant science, agribusiness, agricultural technology and forestry. Students will also develop workplace readiness skills and goal setting. FFA and SAE activities such as field trips and career development events are also a part of the course. Students and parents will be notified of field trips day and should dress appropriately for these trips.

Units

In this class students will come to understand the broad spectrum of agriculture. This will include:

- Plant Sciences
- o Agribusiness
- Agriculture Technology

Goals for the year Students will:

- Participate in a student organization (FFA)
- Demonstrate Virginia's workplace readiness skills in course activities
- Identify internet safety and procedures
- Practice Leadership Skills
- Explore supervised agricultural experiences
- Explore the agriculture industry
- Recognize the importance of agriculture
- Explore plant science, animal science, and agribusiness
- Recognize the importance of natural resource management

Homework and Class Work

Course work will consist of major assessments, which include unit tests, exams, and projects, quizzes, class work and participation, which includes a weekly binder check, and homework as
