complaining! Students told which artist they discovered or RE-discovered to be inspired by when they created their piece. Ms. Amy Grady guided the process along with Ms. Wolfe. She also composed the *No Place for Hate* mural that students and staff contributed to.

At RCHS, Ms.Richardson brought in the same group of artists that came in 2007 to make this memorable schoolwide enrichment project happen. The project was underwritten by a Path Foundation grant and fundraising Mr. and Mrs. Richardson did. ## Gifted Services:
