Gratitude has been our theme during November and will continue into December. I have heard the fifth graders' on *Thankful Thursdays*, and remember so many journal entries where our students described the many things they were thankful for enthusiastically. It is rewarding to see so many teachers understanding the need for the development of the whole child by implementing morning meetings, circles of knowledge, math talks and just time for students to communicate. It is a way for us to differentiate easily. Robert Emmons has written the book *Gratitude Works!* He points out that modern social science is now demonstrating what early philosophers knew. "Gratitude takes us outside our scope so we see ourselves as a part of a larger, intricate network ... it functions to help regulate relationships, solidifying and strengthening them." Service projects have been a part of this process, too.

Leo students at RCHS led a drive to collect warm clothing and then used their funds to purchase gifts to send to needy families through Rapp Cares, a group some of the older members helped found.



Our children are all so different and present a variety of challenges often pressing the adults in their



lives to help them make the connections or find the meaning. Focusing on being grateful can help us find some answers for all of them. The Commit to be Fit and Mental Health Intervention Newsletters have provided us with excellent information. Another resource I have learned about is SENG, Supporting Emotional Needs of the Gifted. This organization provides some free resources and a variety of opportunities to help gifted children and adults learn to work with their high sensitivities to feel balanced, happy, and at peace."
