# American Legion Girls State

2 RCHS gals accepted!

The American Legion Girls State Program is a program that teaches young women responsible citizenship and love for God and Country. Since the inception of the Girls State Program in 1937, nearly one million young people have had the opportunity to learn firsthand how their state and local government works. Rising senior girls are allowed to apply to the competitive program which is an intensive week of study, working together as self-governing citizens. They learn how to participate in the functioning of their state's government in

preparation for their future roles as responsible adult citizens. Two girls are selected from each Girls State program to attend Girls Nation, a national government training program. Girls Nation "senators" meet for a week in DC where they run for political office, campaign for the passage of legislation, and possibly meet with government officials. The culminating event of Girls Nation is oftentimes a meeting with the President of the United States at the White House!

This year, two RCHS girls applied and were accepted to Girls State! Congratulations to Ellie Young and Julia Estes!

Exam to be administered next week!

Next Thursday, April 14th, students who have completed a career and technical education (CTE) sequence needing to earn a credential will take the VA Workplace Readiness Exam. The exam can be used to fulfill graduation requirements for an industry credential for students seeking a standard diploma. The exam consists of questions dealing with realworld scenarios students will encounter in their postsecondary life experiences. Students must earn a 75 to pass the exam.
